WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Expands age range for court to deny driving privileges for offenses involving controlled substances or alcohol from youths between ages 13-17 to youths between ages 13-20.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

• Ability of emancipated or working 18-20 year olds to get driving hardship permits if necessary to maintain employment

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Under ORS 809.260, a court must suspend the driving privileges of juveniles between ages 13-17 who are convicted of offenses involving controlled substances (manufacture, delivery or possession) or alcohol. HB 2147 amends ORS 809.260 by increasing the age range from ages 13-17 to ages 13-20.
