WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: This measure increases various public health fees generated from the licensing of radiological devices such as tanning or X-ray machines. Generates about \$350,000 of additional revenue during the 2007-09 biennium with anticipated expenditures of about \$345,000. The expenditures are part of the Department of Human Services' budget, Policy Option Package 105-50, and are included in the Co-chairs' budget.
