**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** This measure increases various public health fees generated from the licensing of radiological devices such as tanning or X-ray machines. Generates about \$350,000 of additional revenue during the 2007-09 biennium with anticipated expenditures of about \$345,000. The expenditures are part of the Department of Human Services' budget, Policy Option Package 105-50, and are included in the Co-chairs' budget.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Amount of revenue generated by HB 2193
- Expenditures associated with radiological regulation in HB 2193
- The need to monitor the health effects of tanning devices
- DHS budget policy option package 105-50

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** The fees for the licensing of various radiological devices such as tanning and X-ray machines have not been raised since 1993. As a result, the inspection program of such devices has a significant back-log.
