WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Establishes the mechanisms for a vehicle appraiser certificate and a master appraiser certificate to be issued by the Department of Transportation. Establishes that a person commits the offense of acting as a vehicle appraiser without a certificate if they do not possess either a vehicle appraiser or master vehicle appraiser certificate or a vehicle appraiser certificate from another state.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Replaces the bill.

BACKGROUND: HB 2435 A establishes the mechanisms for the Department of Transportation (ODOT) to issue vehicle appraiser and master vehicle appraiser certificates. Under the measure, ODOT has the authority to adopt rules which establish the educational requirements a person must meet before applying for an initial certificate or its renewal. To offset program costs, the measure increases the current fee for the issuance and renewal of a vehicle appraiser certificate at \$150.

HB 2435 A also establishes a Class A violation for a person who misrepresents themselves as a vehicle appraiser or master vehicle appraiser and performs appraisal work without a license. The measure exempts vehicle dealer licensees or those who hold vehicle appraiser license from another state.
