WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Specifies types of schools and programs to which Department of Human Services may refer a person for vocational training. Provides definitions for vocational training and vocational rehabilitation training.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Concern over state rehabilitation money being spent at unsanctioned schools or programs
- Problems in Oregon have mostly centered around career schools
- Abuses in other states have drawn media attention

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: HB 2633-A provides definitions for vocational rehabilitation training and vocational training, clarifying the difference between the two. The measure states that the Department of Human Services may refer a person for vocational training only to certain schools/programs, namely: schools accredited by the U.S. Department of Education, schools approved by the Oregon Student Assistance Commission to confer degrees, community colleges, state post-secondary institutions, Oregon Health and Science University, licensed career schools, and registered apprenticeship programs.
