REVENUE: No revenue impact

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires Department of Human Services to adopt bill of rights for residents and patients of long-term care facilities. Establishes that rights adopted be in addition to current rights under statute. Requires that resident's rights include receiving care from trained staff specific to resident's disease or medical condition and modified or special diet that meets the specific requirements of the resident's disease or medical condition.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Deletes language relating to medication administration.

BACKGROUND: Statute defines "Long-term care facility" as a facility with permanent facilities that include inpatient beds providing medical services, including nursing services but excluding surgical procedures except as may be permitted by the rules of the director, to provide treatment for two or more unrelated patients [ORS 442.015(22)]. Long-term care facilities include skilled nursing facilities and intermediate care facilities but may not be construed to include facilities licensed and operated pursuant to ORS 443.400 to 443.455. The nursing home patients' bill of rights, as defined in ORS 441.610, stipulates that:

- (1) The Department of Human Services shall adopt a nursing home patients' bill of rights consistent with the principles set forth in ORS 441.605. The rules shall be applicable to all residents and as far as practicable shall conform to any federal nursing home patients' bill of rights.
- (2) The department shall periodically review the rules to assure that they meet the principles set forth in ORS 441.605 and that they are in conformity with federal standards but in no case shall the rules be less protective than required by ORS 441.605.
- (3) The department shall be guided by federal interpretative standards in its enforcement of the nursing home patients' bill of rights. [1979 c.261 §5; 1987 c.397 §2]
