**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** According to the Oregon Department of Forestry, biomass refers to woody materials that do not have commercial value, including trees with a diameter of less than six inches and the tops of larger trees. In 2005, Governor Kulongoski adopted the Renewable Energy Action Plan which recommended the increased use of forest biomass as a source of energy. In a 2007 report, The Oregon Department of Forestry's Biomass Work Group concluded that the lack of a predictable supply of biomass has proved to be a major obstacle in attracting private investment in biomass energy facilities.
