## EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Les Schwab was born in Bend, Oregon in 1917 and recently died at the age of 89. Schwab was orphaned at age 15 and supported himself and his siblings by delivering the Oregon Journal newspaper. He graduated from Bend High School in 1935. Les Schwab married Dorothy Harlan and was the father of Harlan and Margaret.

In 1952, Les Schwab purchased an O.K. Rubber Welders shop in Prineville. In 1956, Schwab separated from the O.K. franchise and created the Les Schwab Tire Centers. Now, his 410 tire stores are located in seven states.
