SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates crime of forcible restraint. Punishes by maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to forcible restraint of another person.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 163.215 to 5 163.257.

6 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) A person commits the crime of forcible restraint if, without consent or

7 legal authority, the person knowingly confines or restrains another person against the other

8 person's will. A person is confined or restrained if the person's freedom to move about or

9 leave a premises or vehicle is restricted by physical interference, force, threat, intimidation
10 or deception.

11 (2) It is a defense to a prosecution under subsection (1) of this section if:

12 (a) The person confines or restrains a relative under 16 years of age; and

(b) The sole purpose of the person is to assume control of the person confined or re strained.

15 (3) Forcible restraint is a Class A misdemeanor.

16 (4) Notwithstanding subsection (3) of this section, forcible restraint is a class C felony if:

17 (a) The person who confines or restrains another person causes or threatens to cause

18 physical injury during the incident;

19 (b) The forcible restraint is committed in the immediate presence of, or is witnessed by,

20 the person's or the victim's minor child or stepchild or a minor child residing within the

21 household of the person or victim; or

22 (c) The person possesses a weapon during the commission of the crime.
