SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Establishes statewide system administered by Department of Environmental Quality for collection, transportation and recycling of certain electronic devices. Requires manufacturers of covered electronic devices to register for participation in manufacturer program or contractor program. Requires manufacturer or group of manufacturers to provide collection sites. Directs department to provide consumer information explaining system for recycling covered electronic devices. Requires retailers to display and provide consumers with information on system for recycling covered electronic devices.

Prohibits charging of fee for collection of covered electronic devices, with exception for collectors who provide premium service.

Authorizes Environmental Quality Commission to adopt rules to implement system for recycling covered electronic devices.

Establishes Covered Electronic Devices Account. Continuously appropriates moneys in account to Department of Environmental Quality to pay costs of implementing recycling system and enforcing disposal prohibitions.

Imposes civil penalty for disposal of, or knowingly accepting for disposal, covered electronic devices at solid waste disposal site. Imposes civil penalties for other violations of provisions related to collection and recycling of electronic devices.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

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8	SECTION 1. The Legislative Assembly finds that:
9	(1) It is necessary to encourage the design of electronic devices that are more resource-
10	efficient, more recyclable and less environmentally toxic;
11	(2) The development and availability of a statewide system that conveniently serves both
12	urban and rural areas of Oregon for the collection, transportation and recycling of electronic
13	devices is in the best interest of the state; and
14	(3) A statewide collection, transportation and recycling system should be financed by the
15	manufacturers of those electronic devices.
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17	DEFINITIONS
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19	SECTION 2. As used in sections 2 to 13 of this 2007 Act:

(1) "Brand" means a name, symbols, words or marks that identify a covered electronic 1 2 device, rather than any of its components, and attribute the device to the owner of the brand as the manufacturer. 3

(2) "Collector" means an entity that collects covered electronic devices as part of a 4 manufacturer program or the state contractor program. 5

(3)(a) "Covered electronic device" means: 6

(A) A computer monitor of any type having a viewable area greater than four inches 7 measured diagonally; 8

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(B) A desktop computer or portable computer; or

(C) A television of any type having a viewable area greater than four inches measured 10 diagonally. 11

12(b) "Covered electronic device" does not include:

13 (A) Any part of a motor vehicle;

(B) Any part of a larger piece of equipment designed and intended for use in an indus-14 15 trial, commercial or medical setting, such as diagnostic, monitoring or control equipment;

16(C) Telephones or personal digital assistants of any type unless the telephone or personal digital assistant contains a viewable area greater than four inches measured diagonally; or 17

18 (D) Any part of a clothes washer, clothes dryer, refrigerator, freezer, microwave oven, conventional oven or range, dishwasher, room air conditioner, dehumidifier or air purifier. 19

(4) "Covered entity" means any Oregon household, a business that employs 10 or fewer 20individuals, a not-for-profit organization exempt from taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the 2122Internal Revenue Code that employs 10 or fewer individuals, or any person giving seven or 23fewer covered electronic devices to a collector at any one time.

- (5) "Environmentally sound management practices" means practices that comply with 24 all applicable laws, including but not limited to adequate record keeping, tracking the fate 25of recycled materials, performance audits and inspections, provisions for reuse and 2627refurbishment, compliance with worker health and safety requirements, maintaining liability insurance and financial assurances and practices that may be adopted by rule by the Envi-28ronmental Quality Commission. 29
- 30 (6)(a) "Manufacturer" means any person, irrespective of the selling technique used, in-31 cluding by means of remote sale:

(A) That manufactures covered electronic devices under a brand that it owns or is li-32censed to use; 33

34 (B) That sells covered electronic devices manufactured by others under a brand that the 35 seller owns:

(C) That manufactures covered electronic devices without affixing a brand; 36

37 (D) That manufactures covered electronic devices to which it affixes a brand that it does 38 not own; or

(E) On whose account covered electronic devices manufactured outside the United States 39 are imported into the United States. This subparagraph does not apply if, at the time the 40 covered electronic devices are imported into the United States, another person is registered 41 as the manufacturer of the brand of the covered electronic devices. 42

(b) "Manufacturer" does not include a person with a license to manufacture covered 43 electronic devices for delivery exclusively to or at the order of the licenser. 44

(7) "Manufacturer program" means a statewide plan for collecting, transporting and re-45

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cycling covered electronic devices that is provided by a single manufacturer or group of 1 2 manufacturers pursuant to section 5 of this 2007 Act. (8) "Orphan device" means a covered electronic device for which no manufacturer can 3 be identified. 4 (9) "Person" means the United States, the state or a public or private corporation, local 5 government unit, public agency, individual, partnership, association, firm, trust, estate or 6 7 other legal entity. (10) "Portable computer" means any of the following that has a viewable area greater 8 9 than four inches measured diagonally and that can be carried as one unit by an individual: 10 (a) A laptop computer; 11 (b) A notebook computer; or 12(c) A notepad computer. (11) "Premium service" means services such as at-location system upgrade services and 13 at-home pickup services, including curbside pickup service. 14 15 (12)(a) "Recycling" means: (A) Processing through disassembling, dismantling, shredding, transforming or remanu-16 facturing covered electronic devices, components and by-products into usable or marketable 17 raw materials or products in a manner such that the original products may lose their iden-18 tity; or 19 (B) Smelting materials from components removed from covered electronic devices to re-2021cover metals for reuse in conformance with applicable laws and rules. 22(b) "Recycling" does not include: 23(A) Landfill disposal or incineration of covered electronic devices; or (B) Energy recovery or energy generation by means of combusting covered electronic 24 devices, components and by-products with or without other waste. 25(13) "Retailer" means a person that offers new covered electronic devices for sale at re-2627tail through any means, including but not limited to remote offerings such as sales outlets, catalogs or the Internet. 28(14) "Return share" means the minimum percentage of covered electronic devices that 2930 an individual manufacturer is responsible for collecting, transporting and recycling. 31 (15) "Return share by weight" means the minimum total weight of covered electronic devices that an individual manufacturer is responsible for collecting, transporting and recy-32cling. 3334 (16)(a) "Sell" or "sale" means any transfer of title for consideration, including but not limited to remote sales conducted through sales outlets, catalogs or the Internet, or any 35 other similar electronic means. 36 (b) "Sell" or "sale" does not include leases. 37 38 (17) "State contractor program" means a statewide program for collecting, transporting and recycling covered electronic devices that is provided by the Department of Environ-39 mental Quality for manufacturers who pay a recycling fee to the department pursuant to 40 section 7 of this 2007 Act. 41 42**MANUFACTURERS** 43 44 SECTION 3. (1) Sections 2 to 13 of this 2007 Act apply to all manufacturers engaging in 45

the activities set forth in section 2 (6) of this 2007 Act before, on or after the effective date
 of this 2007 Act.

3 (2) Sections 2 to 13 of this 2007 Act do not apply to reused or refurbished covered elec4 tronic devices.

5 (3) A manufacturer may not sell or offer for sale any covered electronic device in or for 6 delivery in this state unless:

7 (a) The covered electronic device is labeled with a brand and the label is permanently
8 affixed and readily visible; and

9 (b) The brand is included in the plan that is filed with the Department of Environmental
 10 Quality pursuant to section 5 of this 2007 Act.

11 <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) Before January 1 of each year, a manufacturer of covered electronic de-12 vices sold or offered for sale in this state shall register with the Department of Environ-13 mental Quality, for a period to cover the upcoming calendar year, on a form provided by the 14 department. The registration shall include:

(a) A list of all the brands manufactured, sold or imported by the manufacturer, includ ing those brands being offered for sale in this state by the manufacturer.

(b) A statement of whether the manufacturer will be implementing a manufacturer pro gram or utilizing the state contractor program for recycling covered electronic devices.

(c) Any other information required by the department to implement sections 2 to 13 of
 this 2007 Act.

(2)(a) Not later than July 1 of each year, a manufacturer of covered electronic devices
 sold or offered for sale in this state shall pay an annual registration fee to the department.

(b) For calendar years 2008 through 2011, the manufacturer registration fee shall be:

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(A) \$15,000 for manufacturers selling more than one percent of the total number of units
 of covered electronic devices sold in this state the previous calendar year.

(B) \$5,000 for manufacturers selling at least 0.1 percent but not more than one percent
 of the total number of units of covered electronic devices sold in this state the previous
 calendar year.

(C) \$200 for manufacturers selling at least 0.01 percent but less than 0.1 percent of the total number of units of covered electronic devices sold in this state the previous calendar year.

(D) \$40 for manufacturers selling less than 0.01 percent of the total number of units of
 covered electronic devices sold in this state the previous calendar year.

(c) For calendar years 2012 and beyond, the Environmental Quality Commission may
 modify the registration fees under this section so that the total of registration fees collected
 approximately matches the department's costs in implementing sections 2 to 13 of this 2007
 Act, excluding costs incurred under section 10 (4) of this 2007 Act.

(3)(a) If a manufacturer ceases to manufacture, sell or import covered electronic devices
and covered electronic devices manufactured, sold or imported by the manufacturer are
collected for recycling under a manufacturer program or the state contractor program, the
manufacturer shall register with the department and pay a registration fee of \$250.

(b) Any manufacturer described in paragraph (a) of this subsection to which the department provides notification of a return share and return share by weight and that has not
previously filed a registration shall, within 30 days of receiving the notification, file a registration with the department and pay to the department a registration fee of \$250.

SECTION 5. (1) A manufacturer choosing to implement a manufacturer program shall 1 2 submit a plan to the Department of Environmental Quality at the time of payment of the annual registration fee required under section 4 of this 2007 Act. 3 (2) The manufacturer's plan must describe how the manufacturer will: 4 (a) Finance, manage and conduct a statewide program to collect covered electronic de-5 vices from covered entities in this state. 6 (b) Provide for environmentally sound management practices to collect, transport and 7 recycle covered electronic devices. 8 9 (c) Provide for advertising and promotion of collection opportunities statewide and on a 10 regular basis. A 14 15 program may provide collection service jointly with another program. 16(3) A manufacturer choosing to implement a manufacturer program shall: (a) Meet or exceed the requirements for collection sites described in subsection (2) of this 1718 section. (b) Provide for collection, transportation and recycling of covered electronic devices for 19 covered entities free of charge, except that a manufacturer that provides premium service 20for a covered entity may charge for the additional cost of that premium service. 2122(c) Implement the plan required under this section. 23(4) A group of manufacturers may choose to implement a manufacturer program as one entity, if in doing so the manufacturers meet the sum of their individual return shares by 24 weight under section 10 (3) of this 2007 Act and that sum is at least five percent. 25(5) By July 1 of each year, a manufacturer that does not meet its return share by weight 2627for the previous calendar year shall pay the department for the amount not achieved at a rate determined by the department to be equivalent to the amount the manufacturer would 28

have paid, plus 10 percent, to be part of the state contractor program under section 10 of this
2007 Act.

(6) A manufacturer participating in the state contractor program under section 10 of this
 2007 Act shall notify the department at the time of its registration each year.

(7) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, a manufacturer with less than a
 five percent return share is required to participate in the state contractor program under
 section 10 of this 2007 Act.

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(c) Implement the plan required under this section.

(d) Conduct a statistically significant sampling or actual count of the covered electronic devices collected and recycled by the manufacturer each calendar year using a methodology approved by the department. The manufacturer shall report the results of the sampling or count to the department no later than March 1 of the following calendar year. The report must include:

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(A) A list of all brands identified during the sampling or count by the manufacturer;

(B) The weight of covered electronic devices identified for each brand during the sampl ing or count; and

(C) The total weight of covered electronic devices, including orphan devices, collected
 from covered entities in the state by the manufacturer during the previous calendar year.

(e) By March 1 of each year, provide a report to the department that details how the plan
 required under this section was implemented during the previous calendar year.

(4) A group of manufacturers may choose to implement a manufacturer program as one entity,
if in doing so the manufacturers meet the sum of their individual return shares by weight under
section 10 (3) of this 2007 Act and that sum is at least five percent.

(5) By July 1 of each year, a manufacturer that does not meet its return share by weight for the previous calendar year shall pay the department for the amount not achieved at a rate determined by the department to be equivalent to the amount the manufacturer would have paid, plus 10 percent, to be part of the state contractor program under section 10 of this 2007 Act.

(6) A manufacturer participating in the state contractor program under section 10 of this 2007
 Act shall notify the department at the time of its registration each year.

(7) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, a manufacturer with less than a five
 percent return share is required to participate in the state contractor program under section 10 of
 this 2007 Act.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> By September 1 of each year, a manufacturer that participates in the state contractor program shall pay a recycling fee to the Department of Environmental Quality in an amount determined by the department under section 10 (6) of this 2007 Act to cover the costs of collecting, transporting and recycling the manufacturer's annual return share of covered electronic devices for the following year.

1	(7) Maintain on its website information on collection opportunities for covered electronic
2	devices, including collection site locations and hours. The information must be made avail-
3	able in a printable format for retailers.
4	(8) Report biennially to the Legislative Assembly on the operation of the statewide sys-
5	tem for collection, transportation and recycling of covered electronic devices.
6	SECTION 11. The Environmental Quality Commission may adopt rules as necessary to
7	implement sections 2 to 13 of this 2007 Act.
8	SECTION 12. Fees collected by the Department of Environmental Quality under sections
9	2 to 13 of this 2007 Act shall be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the Covered
