SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Permits police officer to take breath test of person operating motor vehicle when officer has reasonable suspicion person is driving while under influence of intoxicants.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to driving while under the influence of intoxicants.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle 5 Code.

6 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) When a police officer has reasonable suspicion to believe that a person

7 is driving while under the influence of intoxicants due to the manner in which a person is

operating a motor vehicle, the officer may require the person to provide a sample of the
person's breath for a preliminary screening test.

10 (2) The results of a preliminary screening test may be used for the purpose of deter-11 mining whether there is probable cause to make an arrest of the person for violation of ORS

12 **813.010**, driving while under the influence of intoxicants.

(3) The results of a preliminary screening test, described in this section, may not be used
 as evidence in any court proceeding.

(4) A refusal to take the preliminary screening test, described in this section, may not
 be used as evidence of violation of ORS 813.095, refusal to take a breath test.
