House Bill 2921

Sponsored by Representative BUCKLEY

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Creates exception to prohibition of practicing law without license for lay representation in land use planning procedures.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to lay representation in land use planning; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section, "lay representative" means an individual with 5 credentials or experience indicating appropriate subject matter expertise in a discipline re-6 lated to the land use planning decision at issue, including but not limited to the disciplines 7 of planning, engineering and architecture.

8 (2) Notwithstanding ORS 9.160, when participating in a legislative or quasi-judicial land 9 use planning process relating to the application of a statewide land use planning goal, a 10 provision of ORS chapter 195, 196, 197 or 215 or ORS 227.160 to 227.186, or a comprehensive 11 plan and land use regulations implementing the plan, a person may be advised or represented 12 by an attorney or by an authorized lay representative on a matter that requires the exercise 13 of informed or trained discretion.

(3) Before agreeing to perform a service authorized by this section, a lay representative
 shall provide the following written notice to the party being represented in at least 12-point
 type:

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YOU WILL BE REVIEWING, APPROVING AND SIGNING IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS.
 LEGAL CONSEQUENCES FOLLOW FROM THE SELECTION AND USE OF THESE DOCU MENTS. THESE CONSEQUENCES AFFECT YOUR RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS. YOU MAY
 CONSULT AN ATTORNEY ABOUT THESE DOCUMENTS. YOU SHOULD CONSULT AN
 ATTORNEY IF YOU HAVE QUESTIONS OR CONCERNS ABOUT THE TRANSACTION OR
 ABOUT THE DOCUMENTS.

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(4) The Land Conservation and Development Commission, in consultation with the Attorney General, by rule shall establish standards for lay representation that do not have the
effect of precluding lay representation as described in subsection (2) of this section.

30 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Land Conservation and Development Commission shall adopt the rules 31 required by section 1 of this 2007 Act on or before January 1, 2008.

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1 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 1 of this 2007 Act becomes operative January 1, 2008.

2 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect
on its passage.

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
