## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Directs Department of Transportation to erect and maintain roadside memorial sign for pedestrian or bicyclist killed in motor vehicle accident, upon application by immediate family member.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to roadside memorial signs.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle
5	Code.
6	SECTION 2. (1) The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain a roadside
7	memorial sign that commemorates a bicyclist or pedestrian killed in an accident involving a
8	motor vehicle if:
9	(a) The bicyclist or pedestrian dies as a result of an accident involving a motor vehicle
10	on a state highway and the driver of the motor vehicle is convicted of an offense related to
11	the accident; and
12	(b) An immediate family member of the victim submits an application to the department
13	within 18 months after the accident date.
14	(2) The department shall develop and provide an application form for the purpose of this
15	section.
16	(3) An application for a roadside memorial sign must include all of the following:
17	(a) Name, address and telephone number of the applicant.
18	(b) Full name of the victim.
19	(c) Relationship of the applicant to the victim.
20	(d) Date, circumstances and location of the accident.
21	(e) Proof of conviction of the driver.
22	(f) Payment of a fee determined by the department by rule. The fee under this paragraph
23	may not exceed the direct and indirect expenses associated with erecting and maintaining a
24	roadside memorial sign.
25	(4) The department by rule shall establish the size, design and location of a roadside
26	memorial sign erected under this section, except that the sign must include the name of the
27	victim.
28	(5) The department shall maintain a roadside memorial sign erected under this section
29	for three years.
30	(6) As used in this section, "immediate family member" means father, mother, child,

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- 1 sibling, parent, spouse, grandparent, stepparent or stepchild.
- 2 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 2 of this 2007 Act applies to accidents involving motor vehicles that
- 3 occur on or after the effective date of this 2007 Act.

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
