House Bill 3168

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Allows person to accompany person with disability to assist with hunting activities.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to hunting; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 498.136 and 498.170.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 498.170 is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 498.
5	SECTION 2. ORS 498.170 is amended to read:
6	498.170. (1) A person [who is not visually impaired and] who accompanies a [hunter who possesses
7	a visually impaired hunter license] person with a disability who is lawfully hunting may:
8	(a) Assist the [hunter] person with a disability in selecting a game animal or bird;
9	(b) Assist the person with a disability in the aiming or sighting of a firearm;
10	(c) Advise the [hunter] person with a disability when to fire a firearm;
11	(d) Shoot a game animal or bird on behalf of the [hunter] person with a disability while in the
12	immediate presence of the [hunter] person with a disability; and
13	(e) Tag and retrieve game animals and birds on behalf of the [hunter] person with a
14	disability.
15	(2) [The] A person accompanying a [hunter who is visually impaired] person with a disability
16	who is lawfully hunting:
17	(a) Shall be required to possess a valid hunting license[. The person accompanying a visually
18	impaired hunter]; and
19	(b) May [also] hunt game animals or birds if the person possesses the appropriate tags, permits
20	and stamps for the area and time period.
21	(3) A [hunter who possesses a visually impaired hunter license] person with a disability hunting
22	with the assistance of another person pursuant to this section must comply with all [other] tag,
23	permit and stamp requirements of the State Fish and Wildlife Commission and applicable hunting
24	laws.
25	[(4) As used in this section, "visually impaired hunter" means a person who files proof with the
26	commission that the person's central visual acuity does not exceed $20/200$ in the better eye with best
27	correction or that the person's visual acuity, if better than $20/200$, is accompanied by a limit to the field
28	of vision to such a degree that its widest diameter subtends an angle of no greater than 20 degrees.]
29	SECTION 3. ORS 498.136 is amended to read:
30	498.136. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, [no] a person [shall] may not
31	hunt wildlife from a motor-propelled vehicle.

32 (2) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission, by rule, may authorize hunting from a motor-

1 propelled vehicle by a person with a disability or for the purpose of alleviating damage by wildlife

2 to other resources.

3 (3) Nothing in the wildlife laws, or rules adopted pursuant thereto, is intended to prohibit [the 4 able-bodied companion of] **a person accompanying** a person with a disability who is lawfully hunt-5 ing from a motor-propelled vehicle from killing an animal wounded by the [disabled person] **person** 6 with a disability and applying thereto the tag issued to such [disabled person] **person with a dis-**7 ability for the taking of such an animal, even if [that able-bodied] the accompanying person has 8 already validated any tag required for the taking of such an animal. 9
