## House Bill 3204

Sponsored by Representative BARKER (at the request of Associated Oregon Industries)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates crime of organized retail theft. Punishes by maximum of 10 years' imprisonment, \$250,000 fine, or both.

<b>2</b>	Relating to organized retail theft.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 164.
5	SECTION 2. (1) A person commits the crime of organized retail theft if, acting in concert
6	with another person:
7	(a) The person violates ORS 164.015 or aids or abets the other person to violate ORS
8	164.015;
9	(b) The subject of the theft is merchandise and the merchandise is taken from a
10	mercantile establishment; and
11	(c)(A) The aggregate value of the merchandise taken within any 180-day period exceeds
12	\$1,000; or
13	(B) The person has the intent to resell the merchandise.
14	(2) As used in this section:
15	(a) "Mercantile establishment" has the meaning given that term in ORS 30.870.
16	(b) "Merchandise" has the meaning given that term in ORS 30.870.
17	(3) Organized retail theft is a Class B felony.
