SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

Directs State Parks and Recreation Department to enhance Eugene-Springfield Willamette River corridor in preparation for 2008 Olympic Track and Field Trials.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to department for expenses related to enhancement.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to 2008 Olympic Track and Field Trials; appropriating money; and declaring an emergency.

Whereas Eugene will host the 2008 Olympic Track and Field Trials at the University of 3 Oregon's Hayward Field, one of the most revered sites in the sport; and 4

Whereas the Olympic Track and Field Trials are the largest national championship track meet $\mathbf{5}$ in the world; and 6

Whereas more than 1,000 athletes are expected to compete for the right to represent Team USA 7 at the Olympic Games; and 8

Whereas more than 350,000 fans attended the last two Olympic Track and Field Trials and more 9 than 1,000 members of the media from around the world cover the event while thousands of volun-10 teers and officials provide support; and 11

12 Whereas this is an event of national significance with an economic impact and tourism oppor-13 tunities for the entire state; and

Whereas the Eugene-Springfield Willamette River corridor lacks adequate signage, adequate 14 waste disposal and recycling receptacles to ensure the cleanliness of the area; and 15

Whereas enhancements are necessary for the Autzen footbridge, the main traffic route for visi-16 17 tors moving between events during the 2008 Olympic Track and Field Trials; now, therefore,

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 18

SECTION 1. (1) In preparation for the 2008 Olympic Track and Field Trials, the State 19 20 Parks and Recreation Department, in consultation and collaboration with the City of Eugene,

the City of Springfield and other interested parties, shall implement projects to enhance, 21

clean up, revitalize and ensure safety within the Eugene-Springfield Willamette River corri-2223dor.

24 (2) These projects shall include, but not be limited to:

- (a) Improving lighting along the Willamette River bike paths; 25
- 26 (b) Placing permanent signage along the bike paths that direct visitors and tourists to

1 areas of local interest and importance;

2 (c) Placing permanent signage related to environmental education topics along the bike 3 paths;

4 (d) Ensuring that sufficient permanent recycling and waste disposal bins are available in 5 the Eugene-Springfield Willamette River corridor;

- 6 (e) Cleaning up and enhancing the appearance of the Autzen footbridge;
- 7 (f) Removing invasive species along the Willamette River and planting native plants; and
- 8 (g) Placing informational kiosks throughout the area.

9 (3) The department shall provide technical assistance as necessary and appropriate to the 10 City of Eugene, the City of Springfield and other interested parties for the purposes of car-11 rying out the provisions of this section.

12 <u>SECTION 2.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-13 ated to the State Parks and Recreation Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, 14 out of the General Fund, the amount of \$240,000, which shall be expended for the purpose 15 of carrying out the provisions of section 1 of this 2007 Act.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect
July 1, 2007.
