House Bill 3533

Sponsored by Representative HANNA; Representatives GREENLICK, RICHARDSON, SCOTT, WHISNANT

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Real Health Care for Kids Act.

Requires Director of Human Services and Legislative Fiscal Officer to evaluate cost and feasibility of offering primary care services to all children in state through school-based health centers, federally qualified health centers and safety net clinics and to report findings to Legislative Assembly.

Requires Department of Human Services to streamline application process for families with children applying for state medical assistance.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to health care for children; creating new provisions; amending ORS 414.047; and declaring

3 an emergency.

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4 Whereas all Oregon children must have access to essential health care and health care services,

including inoculations, physical checkups, dental care, vision testing, nutritional counseling and
treatment of acute conditions; and

7 Whereas Oregon's 44 school-based health centers have served over 20,000 children with nearly 8 64,000 visits; and

9 Whereas 60 percent of the patients of school-based health centers were unlikely to receive care 10 outside of the center; and

11 Whereas 68 percent of patients reported that their health was improved because of the school-12 based health center; and

Whereas the State of Oregon contributed \$1.25 million to school-based health centers, which supported the delivery of over \$2.4 million in health care services, including over \$945,000 in health

15 care services to uninsured students; and

16 Whereas the Legislative Assembly declares that it is the policy of the state that all children 17 have access to real health care; now, therefore,

18 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2007 Act shall be known and may be cited as the Real
 Health Care for Kids Act.

21 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Director of Human Services, in collaboration with the Legislative 22 Fiscal Officer, shall:

(a) Evaluate the feasibility, in every geographic region of the state, of expanding the
number and capacity of school-based health centers, federally qualified health centers and
other safety net clinics to provide primary care services to all children within a school district or a center and clinic service area;

- 27 (b) Estimate the cost of the expansion described in this subsection; and
- 28 (c) Report the findings of the evaluation and the estimated cost to the Legislative As-

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1	sembly at the special session in 2008 of the Seventy-fourth Legislative Assembly or the reg-
2	ular session of the Seventy-fifth Legislative Assembly, whichever occurs first.
3	(2) As used in this section:
4	(a) "Children" means persons under 19 years of age.
5	(b) "Federally qualified health center" means:
6	(A) A health center funded under section 330 of the Public Health Service Act, 42 U.S.C.
7	254b;
8	(B) An entity that meets the definition of "health center" under section 330 of the Public
9	Health Service Act, 42 U.S.C. 254b, but that does not receive grant funding under that Act;
10	or
11	(C) An outpatient health program or facility operated by a tribal organization under the
12	Indian Self-Determination Act, 25 U.S.C. 450 et seq., or an urban Indian organization under
13	the Indian Health Care Improvement Act, 25 U.S.C. 1601 et seq.
14	(c) "Safety net clinic" means a medical clinic that provides health care services to per-
15	sons experiencing financial, language or other barriers to accessing necessary health care
16	services.
17	SECTION 3. ORS 414.047 is amended to read:
18	414.047. (1) Application for any category of aid shall also constitute application for medical as-
19	sistance.
20	(2) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each person requesting medical assistance shall
21	make application therefor to the Department of Human Services. The department shall determine
22	eligibility for and fix the date on which such assistance may begin, and shall obtain such other in-
23	formation required by the rules of the department.
24	(3) If an applicant is unable to make application for medical assistance, an application may be
25	made by someone acting responsibly for the applicant.
26	(4) The department shall streamline the application process for families that include
27	children under 19 years of age by:
28	(a) Eliminating administrative barriers to submitting an application;
29	(b) Reducing unnecessary paperwork;
30	(c) Providing outstationed application sites;
31	(d) Providing enrollment assistance as needed; and
32	(e) Taking other steps the department deems necessary to maximize enrollment in state
33	medical assistance programs.
34	SECTION 4. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
35	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect
36	on its passage.
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
