Senate Bill 156

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates State Drinking Water Advisory Committee to advise and assist Department of Human Services.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to State Drinking Water Advisory Committee.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

- 4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The State Drinking Water Advisory Committee is created to advise and
- 5 assist the Department of Human Services on policies related to the protection, safety and
- 6 regulation of public drinking water in Oregon.
- 7 (2) The committee created under this section shall consist of 15 members appointed by
- the Public Health Officer. The officer shall make the appointments after considering nomi nees from:
- 10 (a) Public water systems of cities with a population greater than 100,000;
- 11 (b) Privately owned water systems;
- 12 (c) Environmental advocacy groups;
- 13 (d) The American Council of Engineering Companies of Oregon;
- 14 (e) The Conference of Local Health Officials created by ORS 431.330;
- 15 (f) The League of Oregon Cities;
- 16 (g) The League of Women Voters of Oregon;
- 17 (h) The Oregon Association of Water Utilities;
- 18 (i) The Oregon Environmental Health Association;
- 19 (j) The Oregon Environmental Laboratory Association;
- 20 (k) The Pacific Northwest Section of the American Water Works Association;
- 21 (L) The Special Districts Association of Oregon;
- 22 (m) Organizations representing plumbers or backflow testers;
- 23 (n) Water consumers; and
- 24 (o) Watershed councils.
- (3) The committee shall adopt rules to govern its proceedings and shall select a chair and
 any other officers it considers necessary.

(4) The members shall be appointed to serve for terms of three years. A vacancy on the
committee shall be filled by appointment by the Public Health Officer for the unexpired term.
(5) The committee shall meet regularly four times a year at times and places fixed by the

30 chair of the committee. The committee may meet at other times specified by the chair or a

- 2 (6) The Department of Human Services shall provide assistance and space for meetings
- 3 as requested by the chair of the committee.
- 4 (7) Members of the committee shall be entitled to actual and necessary expenses as pro-5 vided by ORS 292.495 (2).
- 6 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding the term of office specified in section 1 of this 2007 Act, of
- 7 the members first appointed to the State Drinking Water Advisory Committee:
- 8 (1) Five shall serve for terms ending June 30, 2009.
- 9 (2) Five shall serve for terms ending June 30, 2010.
- 10 (3) Five shall serve for terms ending June 30, 2011.
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
