SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates crime of child neglect in third degree. Punishes by maximum fine of \$360 or, if person has prior conviction for child neglect, punishes by maximum of six months' imprisonment, \$2,500 fine, or both.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to leaving a child unattended in motor vehicle.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 163.505 to 5 163.575.

6 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) As used in this section, "motor vehicle" has the meaning given that term 7 in ORS 801.360.

8 (2) A person having custody or control of a child under 10 years of age commits the of-9 fense of child neglect in the third degree if:

10 (a) The person knowingly or intentionally leaves the child in a motor vehicle;

11 (b) No person in the motor vehicle is 10 years of age or older; and

12 (c)(A) The person does not have a direct view of the child; or

13 (B) The person is more than 50 yards from the motor vehicle.

14 (3)(a) Child neglect in the third degree is a Class B violation.

15 (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, child neglect in the third degree is

16 a Class B misdemeanor if the person has a prior conviction for child neglect.
