Senate Bill 421

Sponsored by Senator GORDLY

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Abolishes Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office. Allows Commission on Hispanic Affairs, Commission on Black Affairs, Commission for Women and Commission on Asian Affairs to hire executive directors and establishes dedicated accounts for those commissions. Appropriates moneys and establishes expenditure limitations for advocacy commissions.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

SECTION 9. The Commission for Women may employ an executive director and other

185.610. (1) The Commission on Asian Affairs is created. The commission has 11 members. Nine of the 11 members shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by the Senate under ORS 171.562 and 171.565. The President of the Senate shall appoint one Senator as a member of the commission, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one Representative as a member of the commission. To the extent possible, members appointed by the Governor shall provide for representation from all areas of the state. All of the members of the commission shall be residents of this state.

(2) The term of office is three years. Appointments to fill a vacancy for an unexpired term shall
 be made by the person who made the original appointment.

(3) The commission shall elect a chairperson and vice chairperson for a term of one year andshall determine the duties of the officers.

(4) A majority of the members of the commission constitutes a quorum for the transaction ofbusiness.

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TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

5 <u>SECTION 17.</u> (1) Any amounts in the Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office Account that 6 are unexpended on the effective date of this 2007 Act are transferred to the Commission on 7 Hispanic Affairs Account, the Commission on Black Affairs Account, the Commission for 8 Women Account and the Commission on Asian Affairs Account in such amounts as may be 9 determined by the Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services. The deci-10 sion of the director on the amounts to be transferred to each account is final and not subject 11 to review.

12(2) Any amounts that are unexpended on the effective date of this 2007 Act and that were 13 authorized to be expended by the Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office from revenues dedicated, continuously appropriated, appropriated or otherwise made available for the purpose 14 15 of administering and enforcing the duties, functions and powers of the office are appropriated 16 and shall be transferred to and are available for expenditure by the Commission on Hispanic Affairs, the Commission on Black Affairs, the Commission for Women and the Commission 17 18 on Asian Affairs for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, for the purpose of administering 19 and enforcing the duties, functions and powers of the commissions. All rights and obligations of the Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office legally incurred under contracts, leases and business transactions executed, entered into or 24 begun before the effective date of this 2007 Act are transferred to the Commission on 25Hispanic Affairs, the Commission on Black Affairs, the Commission for Women and the 2627Commission on Asian Affairs. The Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall determine the rights and obligations to be transferred to each commission. 28The decision of the director on the transfer of rights and obligations is final and not subject 2930 to review. For the purpose of succession to these rights and obligations, the Commission on 31 Hispanic Affairs, the Commission on Black Affairs, the Commission for Women and the Commission on Asian Affairs are a continuation of the Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office 32and not new authorities. 33
