SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Directs State Board of Higher Education to review long-term viability of state institutions of higher education and to report detailed findings of review to Governor and Legislative Assembly no later than February 1, 2009.]

[Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.] Directs Oregon Student Assistance Commission to establish service award voucher program for students studying to become licensed educators. Sets forth qualifications, selection factors, award amounts and employment requirements for students participating in program. Establishes Multicultural Student to Educator Fund for purpose of awarding service

award vouchers.

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Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Student Assistance Commission for Multicultural Student to Educator Fund.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. As used in sections 1 to 5 of this 2007 Act:
5	(1) "Eligible post-secondary institution" means:
6	(a) A state institution under the direction of the State Board of Higher Education listed
7	in ORS 352.002;
8	(b) An Oregon-based, generally accredited, not-for-profit institution of higher education;

14	SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon Student Assistance Commission shall establish the Multi-
15	cultural Student to Educator Program, a service award voucher program for students
16	studying to become licensed educators. To be eligible for participation in the program, a

18	(a) Be registered as a junior or a senior undergraduate student or hold a bachelor's de-
19	gree and be registered in a graduate or post-baccalaureate program in an eligible post-
20	secondary institution;
21	(b) Be enrolled at least half-time in a licensure program approved by the Teacher Stan-

23	(c) Have at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average based on a 4.0 scale at the time

(3) A student seeking to participate in the program may apply directly to the commission 2122or may seek nomination for eligibility by the eligible post-secondary institution the student 23attends. (4) An eligible post-secondary institution may nominate an eligible student to the com-24 25mission to participate in the program. (5) The commission shall determine whether the student qualifies for the program based 2627on the criteria set out in subsection (2) of this section. SECTION 3. (1) The Oregon Student Assistance Commission shall award each participant: 28(a) A \$500 service award voucher for the first year of study after acceptance into the 2930 Multicultural Student to Educator Program; and 31 (b) A \$500 service award voucher for the second year of study after acceptance into the 32program. (2) In addition to the service award vouchers awarded under subsection (1) of this sec-33 34 tion, the commission shall award to each participant who agrees to four years of full-time 35 employment as a teacher in an Oregon school district: (a) A \$2,000 service award voucher after completion of the first year of the full-time 36 37 employment; 38 (b) A \$3,000 service award voucher after completion of the second year of the full-time employment; 39 (c) A \$4,000 service award voucher after completion of the third year of the full-time 40 employment; and 41 (d) A \$5,000 service award voucher after completion of the fourth year of the full-time 42 43 employment. (1) The participant shall complete the employment requirement specified 1718 under section 3 of this 2007 Act not later than six years after the date the participant graduates from the licensure program approved by the Teacher Standards and Practices Com-19 20mission. The Oregon Student Assistance Commission may allow a participant additional time, not to exceed three years, to complete the employment requirement. The total employment 2122requirement period, including any deferment period, may not exceed nine years. The com-23mission may grant a participant additional time to complete the employment requirement as follows: 2425(a) For the period of enrollment if a participant returns to school on a full-time basis in any course of study at an eligible post-secondary institution; 2627(b) Three additional years if the participant enters active service with the Armed Forces of the United States: 28(c) Three additional years if the participant enters the Peace Corps, AmeriCorps, Volun-2930 teers in Service to America or a similar private agency with federal tax-exempt status; 31 (d) For a period of not more than six months if a participant becomes unemployed and provides proof satisfactory to the commission that the participant is actively seeking em-3233 ployment; and 34 (e) For a period determined by the commission for other reasons allowed by the com-35 mission. (2) A participant must hold a bachelor's degree and a nonprovisional license issued by the 36 37 Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to be eligible for the service award vouchers 38 under section 3 (2) or (3) of this 2007 Act. SECTION 5. (1) The Multicultural Student to Educator Fund is established in the State 39 Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned by the Multicultural 40 Student to Educator Fund shall be credited to the fund. Moneys in the fund are continuously 41 appropriated to the Oregon Student Assistance Commission for the purpose of awarding 42 service award vouchers to participants in the Multicultural Student to Educator Program. 43 (2) The commission may seek grants and donations to provide funding for the program. 44 The commission shall deposit any moneys received under this subsection in the fund. 45

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1 SECTION 6. Sections 1 to 5 of this 2007 Act first apply to participants who attend an el-

2 igible post-secondary institution during the 2008-2009 academic year.

3 <u>SECTION 7.</u> There is appropriated to the Oregon Student Assistance Commission, for the

4 biennium beginning July 1, 2007, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$500,000 for the

5 Multicultural Student to Educator Fund established in section 5 of this 2007 Act.

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
