## Senate Bill 637

Sponsored by Senator DECKERT; Senator DEVLIN, Representatives GALIZIO, RILEY (at the request of Exit 282 A Development Co.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Economic and Community Development Department to work with local governments and affected agencies to identify and prioritize up to 25 sites for industrial or traded sector uses.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to economic development.

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**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section, unless the context requires otherwise, "traded 5 sector" has the meaning given that term in ORS 285A.010.

6 (2) The Economic and Community Development Department shall work with local gov-

7 ernments, as defined in ORS 174.116, and affected state agencies to identify and prioritize up

8 to 25 sites to be used for industrial or traded sector uses.

9 (3) The department shall identify sites that are consistent with data collected by the de-10 partment from businesses seeking to locate or expand in Oregon and shall prioritize sites 11 that are:

(a) Of sufficient size to meet industrial or traded sector needs, as expressed in inquiries
 received by the department from businesses seeking to locate or expand in Oregon;

(b) Served by necessary public facilities and infrastructure, including transportation fa cilities, or can be provided with the facilities and infrastructure within a reasonable period
 of time; and

(c) Subject to few, if any, environmental constraints, or constraints that can be mitigated
 within a reasonable period of time.

(4) At least one of the 25 sites must be in the Portland metropolitan area, as defined in
 ORS 778.005. Preference must be given to a site that:

21 (a) Is contiguous to a city's urban growth boundary on the effective date of this 2007 Act;

22 (b) Contains at least 100 acres;

23 (c) Is within three miles of primary access to an interstate highway; and

(d) Is served by adequate transportation, sewer and water facilities or is located where
adequate services can be made available within 12 months after the date the site is to be
added to the urban growth boundary.

(5) To assist the department in identifying and prioritizing sites under this section, the Director of the Economic and Community Development Department shall convene an advisory committee consisting of eight members, including a county representative and a city representative, who are knowledgeable about the need for and requirements of industrial and traded sector development and the availability of land for industrial or traded sector devel1 opment within this state.

2 (6) The department shall:

3 (a) Identify and prioritize sites under this section not later than December 15, 2008; and

4 (b) Once sites are identified, give the sites priority for receipt of technical assistance 5 with planning and permitting and with grant or loan assistance.

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
