Senate Bill 646

Sponsored by Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representative LIM

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Limits biennial expenditures for payments of expenses of Gresham Center for the Arts from lottery moneys allocated from Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to Gresham Center for the Arts; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is allocated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services

5 from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund the amount identified in 6 subsection (2) of this section.

7 (2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$_______ is es8 tablished for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for payment of ex9 penses by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services from the Administrative
10 Services Economic Development Fund for the Gresham Center for the Arts.

(3) The allocation of moneys from the Administrative Services Economic Development
Fund under this section is subject to the requirements in section 4, Article XV of the Oregon
Constitution, for deposit of specified amounts of the net proceeds from the Oregon State
Lottery into the Education Stability Fund and into the Parks and Natural Resources Fund
and shall be made only after satisfaction or payment of:

(a) Amounts allocated to Westside lottery bonds issued under ORS 391.140 or to the re serves or any refunding related to the Westside lottery bonds in accordance with the priority
 for allocation and disbursement established by ORS 391.130;

(b) All liens, pledges or other obligations relating to lottery bonds or refunding lottery
 bonds that are due or payable during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007; and

(c) Amounts required by any other pledges of, or liens on, net proceeds from the Oregon
 State Lottery.

23 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 24 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect 25 on its passage.

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
