## Senate Bill 766

Sponsored by Senator MORRISETTE

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Allows Department of Human Services to make grants to or enter into contracts with nonprofit organizations that operate centers for purpose of providing certain services to individuals with disabilities.

Appropriates moneys for purposes of Act. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to individuals with disabilities; appropriating money; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Sections 2 to 5 of this 2007 Act are added to and made a part of ORS chapter 5 430.

6 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Director of Human Services may make grants to and enter into 7 contracts with private nonprofit organizations that provide or propose to provide support 8 services to individuals with disabilities. Grants or contracts under this section may be for 9 the funding of service centers for individuals with disabilities. The centers may provide the 10 following services:

(a) Emergency and crisis shelter, assistance in arranging transitional and permanent
 housing, crisis stabilization services in cooperation with community mental health and de velopmental disabilities programs, police departments and hospitals, mentoring, mental
 health counseling, direct therapy services, case management, transportation or day care
 services;

(b) Access to or assistance in acquiring assistive technology, including but not limited
 to wheelchairs, text telephones and braille writers;

(c) Assessments and evaluations, including assessments and evaluations of an individual's
 daily living skills, education skills and employment skills;

20 (d) Assistance to individuals with disabilities in developing and securing self-directed 21 supports;

(e) Daily living skills training, vocational training, computer training, legal assistance and assistance with access to social and recreational opportunities; and

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(f) Any other services to individuals with disabilities approved by the director.

25 (2) Services provided under subsection (1) of this section shall be based on the principle 26 of self-determination and designed for purposes of supporting the long term goals of the in-

27 dividuals with disabilities.

28 <u>SECTION 3.</u> The Director of Human Services shall establish by rule minimum standards 29 for service centers receiving grants or contracts under section 2 of this 2007 Act.

30 <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) A private nonprofit organization operating or proposing to operate a

1 service center described in section 2 of this 2007 Act may apply to the Director of Human

2 Services for a grant under section 2 of this 2007 Act. The organization must submit to the

3 director, at the time of application:

4 (a) A statement of services provided or to be provided;

5 (b) Proof of maintenance of accurate and complete financial records;

6 (c) Clearly defined written policies and procedures; and

7 (d) A list of members of the governing board.

8 (2) The director shall approve or reject applications within 60 days after receipt. The di-9 rector shall mail written notification to the applicant no later than five business days fol-10 lowing final action taken on the application.

(3) The director shall consider the geographic area of the state from which an application
is submitted with the intent that all areas of the state develop programs to serve individuals
with disabilities.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Services provided by centers receiving grants or entering into contracts under section 2 of this 2007 Act shall be made accessible and available to all persons who reside in the area served who may need the services. If a center receiving funds under section 2 of this 2007 Act is unable to provide necessary services to a client, it shall refer the client to alternative community resources.

19 <u>SECTION 6.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-20 ated to the Department of Human Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, out of 21 the General Fund, the amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_ for the purposes described in sections 2 to 5 of 22 this 2007 Act.

23 <u>SECTION 7.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 24 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect 25 July 1, 2007.

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
