

Senate Bill 932

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY (at the request of Eugene Police Department)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates crime of failure to identify. Punishes by maximum of 30 days' imprisonment, \$1,250 fine, or both.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to failure to identify to a police officer.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) A person commits the crime of failure to identify if, at the time that a**
5 **police officer stops the person for an offense that is subject to arrest:**

6 (a) **The person fails to produce government-issued identification bearing the person's true**
7 **name, date of birth and current residence address or location; or**

8 (b) **The person is unable to produce government-issued identification and fails to provide**
9 **the police officer with the person's true name, date of birth and current residence address**
10 **or location.**

11 (2) **A police officer may detain a person arrested or cited for the offense described in this**
12 **section only for the time reasonably necessary to investigate and verify the person's identity.**

13 (3) **Failure to identify is a Class C misdemeanor.**
