## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3615

1	Delete lines 4 through 27 of the printed bill and insert:
2	"SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding the word limits described in ORS 250.035 (2), the ballot
3	title for Senate Bill 1087 (2008) shall be:

6	INCREASES SENTENCES FOR DRUG TRAFFICKING, THEFT AGAINST ELDERLY AND
7	SPECIFIED REPEAT PROPERTY AND IDENTITY THEFT CRIMES; REQUIRES AD-
8	DICTION TREATMENT FOR CERTAIN OFFENDERS.
9	
10	RESULT OF "YES" VOTE: "Yes" vote increases sentences for drug trafficking (metham-
11	phetamine, heroin, "ecstasy," cocaine), theft against elderly and specified repeat property
12	and identity theft crimes; requires addiction treatment for certain offenders; establishes this
13	measure as alternative to other specified measure on this ballot to impose minimum sen-
14	tences for listed crimes.
15	
16	RESULT OF "NO" VOTE: "No" vote retains current laws, which provide lesser sentences for
17	specified crimes and do not require treatment for addicted offenders.

19	SUMMARY: This measure increases prison sentences for specified drug and property crimes
20	as follows:
21	
22	• Trafficking of methamphetamine, heroin, "ecstasy," or cocaine: 34 - 130 months, depending
23	on the quantity of drugs and criminal history;
24	
25	• Aggravated theft of over \$10,000 where victim is elderly: 16 - 45 months, depending on
26	criminal history;
27	
28	• Repeat offenses of identity theft, burglary, theft, robbery, mail theft, car theft, forgery,
29	criminal mischief, credit card and check fraud: 18 - 30 months or 24 - 36 months, depending
30	on seriousness of crime and number of past convictions.
31	
32	This measure also requires treatment for certain addicted offenders at risk of reoffending;
33	imposes sanctions for those who refuse treatment. Limits court's ability to reduce sentences.
34 97	Provides grants to counties for operation of local jails, treatment services, intensive super-
35	vision and drug courts.

1 If this measure passes with more votes than other specified measure on this ballot to impose 2 minimum sentences for listed crimes, this measure controls and other measure will have no 3 effect. If this measure passes with fewer votes than other specified measure on this ballot 4 to impose minimum sentences for listed crimes, this measure will have no effect. See Ex-5 planatory Statement for more information.

8 "(2) If a petition is filed under ORS 250.085 challenging the ballot title provided in sub-9 section (1) of this section, the word limits described in ORS 250.035 (2) do not apply for the 10 purposes of judicial review.".
