## EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Replaces the measure.

BACKGROUND: Currently, there are civil and criminal forfeiture statutes. When a vehicle with a hidden compartment is forfeited, law enforcement agencies remove the compartment before selling or disposing of the vehicle. House Bill 2403A provides a process for law enforcement agencies to recoup the cost of removing these compartments.
