WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Allows victims to assert the right to a speedy trial. Provides that victim's assertion of speedy trial rights does not supersede defendant's constitutional rights. Creates procedure for asserting right to speedy trial.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Extensive delay prior to trial
- Effect of delay on victim
- Defense of delay
- Defendant's constitutional rights
- Date certain trial dates
- Procedure for invoking right
- Numerous states with similar victim's rights statutes

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Provides that victim's assertion of speedy trial rights does not supersede defendant's constitutional rights. Creates procedure for asserting right to speedy trial.

BACKGROUND: Currently, defendants in criminal cases have a right to a speedy trial. This bill grants victims the same right and provides that the remedy for violating this provision is to have a trial set with all practicable speed. It gives victims an opportunity to participate in the pre-trial process; acknowledging that a prolonged pre-trail wait can cause mental and emotional strain.
