**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Allows amendment of local ordinances regulating manufactured dwelling park closures until January 1, 2010, if amendment does not reduce rights of tenants. Declares an emergency; effective on passage.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Current state law regulating manufactured dwelling park closures
- Six jurisdictions with local ordinances regulating closures
- Creating a window of opportunity for amendment of local ordinances
- Sunset date requires emergency clause to create window
- Tenant rights cannot be reduced below those specified in statute

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Makes Act effective on passage.

**BACKGROUND:** The passage of 2007 legislation regulating manufactured dwelling park closures created some conflicts with local ordinances in six jurisdictions. HB 3085-A creates a window of opportunity for those jurisdictions to address conflicts by amending local regulations.
