WHAT THE BILL DOES: Redefines environmentally sensitive logging equipment as logging equipment originally manufactured after 1992. Extends the sunset of exemption from property taxation for environmentally sensitive logging equipment and skyline and swing yarders from 2012 to 2018. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

BACKGROUND: Current law defines environmentally sensitive logging equipment as logging equipment manufactured not more than eight years preceding the assessment date for the tax year. HB 3112 redefines environmentally sensitive logging equipment as logging equipment originally manufactured after 1992. It also extends the sunset of exemption from property taxation for environmentally sensitive logging equipment and skyline and swing yarders from 2012 to 2018.
