WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Directs Water Resources Department (WRD), working closely with Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW), to develop integrated state water resources strategy (strategy). Directs that strategy describe Oregon's water needs, including instream, ecosystem services, water quality and water supply needs. Directs that strategy take effect upon adoption by Water Resource Commission (WRC). Requires commission to review and update the strategy every five years. Requires WRD, in consultation with DEQ and ODFW, to submit report to Legislative Assembly detailing progress toward developing strategy by February 1, 2011.

## EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Replaces the measure.

**BACKGROUND:** Oregon is one of two western states without a formal water supply plan. Oregon's surface water is nearly fully allocated during summer months and ground water is showing declines in quantity and quality in some areas. In 2007, the Legislative Assembly allocated funds to the WRD to begin collecting data to increase the state's ability to forecast water demands, as well as identify opportunities for conservation and water storage. This project, known as the Oregon Water Supply and Conservation Initiative (WSCI), started in 2007 and began producing data in 2008.
