EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Senate Bill 835 (2007) requested that the Workers' Compensation Management-Labor Advisory Committee (MLAC) study the adequacy of death-related benefits available to workers' families and dependents under the workers' compensation laws. The management and labor representatives of MLAC found that death benefits were not adequate in amount and too restricted in use, and that in some cases, children and dependents of deceased workers were severely limited in their ability continue their educations. The provisions of this bill arose out of that study, and have been recommended by MLAC.
