WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Subjects persons who violate the Unlawful Debt Collection Practices Act to the provisions of the Unlawful Trade Practices Act.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Debt collection is not currently subject to the provisions of the state's Unlawful Trade Practices Act (UTPA). While an individual may take legal action against a debt collector for violating the Unlawful Debt Collection Practices Act, the Attorney General has no authority to take such action. SB 328 provides the Department of Justice with the authority to enforce debt collection laws in Oregon under the UTPA and to participate in multi-state suits against outof-state debt collectors.
