**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Requires the state initiative and referendum voters' pamphlet to include procedures for filing a complaint alleging violation of elections laws.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

• Cut-off date to print the voters' pamphlet would not allow depiction of last-minute spenders, and so printing the top five spending sources up until that time might be incomplete

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Removes the requirement to list top five spending sources for and against the measure.

**BACKGROUND:** The procedures for filing a complaint alleging violations of elections laws are contained in ORS 260.345. Any elector suspecting violations of elections laws or rules may file a written complaint with any filing officer. Upon receipt of a complaint, the Secretary of State's office must examine the complaint immediately to determine if a violation has occurred. In the case of alleged violations involving the Secretary of State's Office, the Attorney General shall receive and investigate the complaint.
