Summary of Capital Construction and Information Technology Subcommittee Action

Senate Bill 5505 limits the maximum amount of bonds and Certificates of Participation (COPs) or third party financing agreements state agencies may issue and the amount of revenue state agencies may raise from such issuance. The proceeds from the issuance of bonds and COPs are included as revenues in agency budgets. This bill also allocates the federal tax-exempt private activity bond volume cap allowed under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, to certain state agencies and the Private Activity Bond Committee established in ORS 286A.615.

The Subcommittee reviewed amendments to Senate Bill 5505 for the following purposes:

- 1) The Subcommittee approved the Department of Higher Education, Article XI-G general obligation bond authorization of \$144,900,479 based on the bond financing needed for the Department's qualifying capital construction projects approved in Senate Bill 5506 and to authorize financing for certain continuing projects approved during previous legislative sessions.
- 2) The Subcommittee approved the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development Article XI-G general obligation bond authorization for capital construction financing of \$63,233,000 for Oregon Community College projects approved in Senate Bill 5506 and to authorize financing for certain continuing projects approved during previous legislative sessions.
- 3) The Subcommittee approved the Department of Higher Education, Article XI-F(1) general obligation amount of \$488,401,244 to provide the bond financing needed for the Department's capital construction projects approved in Senate Bill 5506, and to authorize financing for certain continuing projects approved during previous legislative sessions.
- 4) The Subcommittee approved the Department of Water Resources, Article XI-I (1) general obligation amount of \$10,000,000 to provide the bond financing needed for water development projects in the Columbia River Basin through the Water Development Fund as authorized in House Bill 3369. In addition, \$15,000,000 of Article XI-I(1) general obligation bonds were authorized for the 2011-13 biennium.
- 5) The Subcommittee increased the Department of Energy, Article XI-J general obligation authority to \$250,000,000 to enable the Department to take advantage of opportunities including energy efficiency and renewable energy projects in public buildings, new construction, loan guarantees and expanded abilities made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.
- 6) The Subcommittee reduced the Department of Administrative Services, Lottery Revenue Bond limit to \$274,300,000. The change is a result of several factors including a reduced amount of Lottery Bond debt capacity and newly identified priorities. This amount provides funding for projects including those authorized in Senate Bill 5535 and House Bill 2001. Authorized projects to be financed during 2009-11 include: \$100 million for *Connect Oregon* multi-modal transportation infrastructure projects; \$19.5 million for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) project in Newport; \$19,400,334 for Housing and Community Services projects to preserve federally-assisted Section 8 housing and Manufactured Dwelling Parks; \$17,526,252 for Economic and Community Development's infrastructure loan program; \$15 million for Department of Forestry land acquisition; \$11,271,656 for County Court Facilities Infrastructure projects; \$7.8 million for the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) project in Tillamook; \$5 million for the Department of Energy for purposes described in House Bill 2626; \$3,552,399 for the Coos Bay Railway project; \$3.5 million for water

development projects and related administration; \$2 million for the Port of Morrow Education Center; \$1.6 million for Lane Transit's West Eugene EmX project; \$1 million for infrastructure improvements at the Pendleton Round-Up; plus \$22,355,000 for Higher Education and \$13,700,000 for Community College projects approved in Senate Bill 5506. Bond limit amounts include required cost of issuance and reserves.

7) The Subcommittee decreased the Department of Administrative Services' authority to issue COPs and enter into Other Financing Agreements to \$764,780,000. A summary of the projects for which use of COP authority is anticipated in 2009-11 is listed below:
