GOVERNOR'S BUDGET: This bill is not anticipated by the Governor's recommended budget.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

ANALYSIS: Senate Bill 401 requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to develop and implement a plan to increase, in underserved regions of the state, the availability of supervision and treatment facilities for persons conditionally released by the Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB). The bill directs DHS to report the plan and the department's progress in implementing the plan to an appropriate committee of the Legislative Assembly by January 15th of each odd-numbered year. This measure also instructs PSRB to provide DHS with necessary information for the development and implementation of the plan. This Act is repealed on January 2, 2016.

DHS reports that passage of this bill will not have a fiscal impact on the agency. The Addictions and Mental Health Division of the Department of Human Services currently has a development plan for PSRB client placement and treatment. Modifying this plan to meet the reporting requirements of this bill will not require more staffing or add new costs.

PSRB currently shares with DHS information about clients on conditional release and the programs supporting those clients. DHS does not anticipate needing additional information from PSRB to meet the requirements of this bill.
