SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Eliminates hunting and fishing license fees for resident war veterans who are certified as having disability of 10 percent or more.

SECTION 1. ORS 497.102 is amended to read:

497.102. (1) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission is authorized to issue, upon application, to 6

persons desiring to hunt wildlife the following licenses and permits and shall charge therefor the 7 8

following fees:

9 (a) Resident annual hunting license to hunt wildlife, \$19.

(b) Nonresident annual hunting license to hunt wildlife, \$73. 10

(c) Resident annual juvenile hunting license for persons 14 through 17 years of age to hunt 11 12 wildlife except those species for which a game mammal tag or permit is required by the wildlife laws or by any rule promulgated pursuant thereto, \$2. 13

14 (d) Resident pioneer hunting license to hunt wildlife for persons 65 years of age or older who have resided in the state for not less than 50 years prior to the date of application, free. 15

(e) Resident annual senior citizen hunting license to hunt wildlife for persons 70 years of age 16 17or older who have resided in the state for not less than five years prior to the date of application, one-half the fee imposed under paragraph (a) of this subsection for a resident annual hunting license 18 19 to hunt wildlife.

20 (f) Resident disabled war veteran hunting license to hunt wildlife for a person who files with the 21commission written proof that the last official certification of record by the United States Depart-22ment of Veterans Affairs or any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States shows the person 23to be at least [25] 10 percent disabled, free.

24 (g) Annual resident private hunting preserve permit to hunt privately owned hunting preserve 25 game birds, \$3.

26 (h) Annual nonresident private hunting preserve permit to hunt privately owned hunting preserve game birds, \$9. 27

(i) Nonresident hunting license to hunt migratory waterfowl and upland birds for three consec-28 utive days, \$20. 29

30 (2) The hunting preserve permits referred to in subsection (1)(g) and (h) of this section are in 31 lieu of the hunting licenses required by the wildlife laws.

(1) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission is authorized to issue, upon application, to 35 resident persons desiring to hunt migratory waterfowl an annual migratory waterfowl stamp and 36 37 shall charge therefor a fee of \$7.50. 38 (2) The stamp referred to in subsection (1) of this section is in addition to and not in lieu of the hunting licenses required by ORS 497.102. 39 40 (3) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section[,]: (a) A migratory waterfowl stamp is not required of a person younger than 14 years of age; and 41 (b) The commission may not charge a fee under this section to a person described in ORS 42 497.102 (1)(f). 43

11	(a) An upland bird stamp is not required of a person younger than 14 years of age; and
12	(b) The commission may not charge a fee under this section to a person described in ORS
