House Bill 2056

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Increases number of public members on health regulatory boards. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ORS 675.100 is amended to read: 6 7 675.100. (1) There hereby is created a State Board of Psychologist Examiners consisting of seven 8 members appointed by the Governor. Of the members appointed to the board: (a) [Five of the members shall] Four must be residents of Oregon, have doctoral degrees with 9 primary emphasis in psychology and [shall] be licensed [under ORS 675.010 to 675.150.] psychol-10 11 ogists; and 12 (b) [Two members shall] Three must be residents of Oregon and [shall] serve as public mem-13bers. 14 (2) The term of office of a board member [shall be] is three years, but [the members shall serve] a member serves at the pleasure of the Governor. Before the expiration of the term of a member, 15 16 the Governor shall appoint a successor to assume duties on July 1 next following. A member shall 17be eligible for one consecutive reappointment only. In case of a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become immediately effective for the unexpired term. 18 19 (3) All appointments of members of the board by the Governor are subject to confirmation by 20 the Senate in the manner provided in ORS 171.562 and 171.565. 21(4) Before entering upon the duties of office, each board member shall subscribe to an oath that 22the member will faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of office and that the member will 23support the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of this state. (2) The public members of the State Board of Pharmacy [*shall*] **must** be residents of this state who have attained the age of majority and [*shall*] **may** not be [*nor shall they*] **and may not** ever have been a member of the profession of pharmacy, or persons who have any immediate family in the profession of pharmacy or persons who have ever had any material financial interest in the providing of pharmacy service or who have engaged in any activity directly related to the practice of pharmacy.

42 (3) The licensed pharmacist members of the board [*shall*] **must** at the time of their appointment:

43 (a) Be residents of this state;

44 (b) Be licensed and in good standing to engage in the practice of pharmacy in this state;

45 (c) Be engaged in the practice of pharmacy in this state; and

1 (d) Have five years of experience in the practice of pharmacy in this state after licensure.

2 (4) The Governor shall appoint the members of the State Board of Pharmacy, subject to the ad-3 vice and consent of the Senate, and in accordance with the other provisions of subsection (5) of this 4 section.

5 (5) At least five recommendations for appointment to each vacancy on the board may be made 6 to the Governor by a task force assembled by the Oregon State Pharmacists Association to repre-7 sent all of the interested pharmacy groups. Such nominations shall be recommendations only and 8 shall not be binding in any manner upon the Governor.

9 (6) Any vacancy which occurs in the membership of the board for any reason, including expira-10 tion of term, removal, resignation, death, disability or disqualification, shall be filled by the Gover-11 nor in the manner prescribed by subsections (4) and (5) of this section. The Governor shall fill 12 vacancies which occur by expiration of full terms within 90 days prior to each date of expiration, 13 and shall fill vacancies which occur for any other reason within 60 days after each such vacancy 14 occurs.

691.485. (1) There is established a Board of Examiners of Licensed Dietitians within the Department of Human Services for the purpose of carrying out and enforcing the provisions of ORS
691.405 to 691.585.

19 (2) The board [shall consist] consists of seven members appointed by the department of which:

20 (a) [*Two*] **Three** are members of the general public;

21 (b) One is a physician trained in clinical nutrition; and

(c) [Four] Three are distitians licensed under ORS 691.405 to 691.585 who have been engaged
 in the practice of distetics for no fewer than five years.

(3) Members of the board [shall be] are appointed for three-year terms and are eligible for
 reappointment[, but none shall]. A member may not serve more than two consecutive terms.

26 (4) Members of the board are entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in ORS 292.495.

27 <u>SECTION 18.</u> (1) A member serving on a health professional regulatory board, as defined 28 in ORS 676.160, or on a board, advisory council or program listed in ORS 676.606 on the ef-29 fective date of this 2009 Act continues to serve until the term of office for which the member 30 was appointed terminates by expiration of time, resignation from the board by the member 31 or removal of the member from office.

(2) When a member's term of service on a health professional regulatory board or on a
 board, advisory council or program terminates, a member who is otherwise eligible for re appointment to the board, council or program may be reappointed, unless the appointment
 exceeds the total appointments authorized for members within the member's classification.

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SECTION 19. Section 18 of this 2009 Act is repealed on June 30, 2014.

SECTION 20. The amendments to ORS 675.100, 675.775, 677.235, 678.140, 678.800, 679.230, 680.556, 681.410, 683.250, 684.130, 685.160, 687.470, 688.160, 688.545, 688.820, 689.115 and 691.485 by sections 1 to 17 of this 2009 Act apply to appointments to health professional regulatory boards, as defined in ORS 676.160, and to boards, advisory councils and programs listed in ORS 676.606 made on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.

42 <u>SECTION 21.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 43 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 44 on its passage.

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
