## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to collect surcharge from state agencies to pay for services that Department of Human Services provides through Oregon Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Services Program.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to surcharge for Oregon Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Services Program.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

SECTION 1. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the Oregon Depart-4  $\mathbf{5}$ ment of Administrative Services shall collect from each state agency, as defined in ORS 6 291.002, a surcharge per full-time equivalent budgeted position in the agency. The department 7 shall determine the amount of the surcharge. All moneys collected under this section shall 8 be deposited in the Oregon Department of Administrative Services Operating Fund. 9 Notwithstanding ORS 283.110, the department shall credit to the Department of Human Ser-10 vices all moneys collected under this section, for the purpose of enabling the Department of 11 Human Services to provide services under ORS 410.740 to other state agencies or to members 12of the public. (2) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services may not impose the surcharge 13 14 described in subsection (1) of this section upon a semi-independent state agency listed in ORS 15 182.454. The Department of Human Services may contract with a semi-independent state 16 agency, in accordance with ORS 283.110, for payment for services described in ORS 410.740
