SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Authorizes prosecution for failure to report as sex offender following change of residence in county in which person previously reported or county in which person resides.

2	Relating to failure to report as a sex offender; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 181.599.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION_1. ORS 181.599 is amended to read:
5	181.599. (1) A person who is required to report as a sex offender and who has knowledge of the
6	reporting requirement commits the crime of failure to report as a sex offender if the person fails,
7	as required by ORS 181.595, 181.596 or 181.597, to:
8	(a) Make the initial report to the appropriate agency or official;
9	(b) Report when the person works at, carries on a vocation at or attends an institution of higher
10	education;
11	(c) Report following a change of residence, school enrollment or employment status, including
12	enrollment, employment or vocation status at an institution of higher education;
13	(d) Make an annual report; or
14	(e) Provide complete and accurate information.
15	(2) Failure to report following a change of residence is committed in either the county
16	in which the person previously reported or the county in which the person is currently re-
17	siding in this state.
18	[(2)] (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsection [(3)] (4) of this section, failure to report as
19	a sex offender is a Class A misdemeanor.
20	[(3)] (4) Failure to report as a sex offender is a Class C felony if the person violates:
21	(a) Subsection (1)(a) of this section; or
22	(b) Subsection (1)(b) or (c) of this section and the crime for which the person is required to re-
23	port is a felony.
24	[(4)] (5) A person who fails to sign and return an address verification form as required by ORS
25	181.598 (2) commits a violation.
26	SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 181.599 by section 1 of this 2009 Act apply to
27	changes of residence made on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.
