75th OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY--2009 Regular Session

House Bill 2520

Sponsored by Representative GREENLICK; Representatives BUCKLEY, CLEM, GARRARD (at the request of Special Districts Association of Oregon)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Authorizes election of board of directors from within district for service district formed to serve unincorporated community or unincorporated area.

2	Relating to the governing body of a service district; creating new provisions; and amending ORS
3	451.410 and 451.485.
4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2009 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 451.410 to
6	451.610.
7	SECTION 2. (1) A board of directors elected from within the territory of the service
8	district may serve as the governing body of a service district that is formed to serve:
9	(a) An urban unincorporated community and, if approved by the governing body of the
10	city, all or part of a city;
11	(b) A rural unincorporated community and, if approved by the governing body of the city,
12	all or part of a city; or
13	(c) An unincorporated area within an acknowledged urban growth boundary.
14	(2) A proposal to establish an elected board of directors for a service district described
15	in subsection (1) of this section may be initiated:
16	(a) By a petition to form or change the organization of the service district; or
17	(b) For an existing service district, on the motion of the governing body of the county
18	that is serving as the governing body of the service district.
19	(3) If a proposal to establish an elected board of directors is contained in a petition
20	seeking formation of a service district described in subsection (1) of this section, the gov-
21	erning body of a county may not modify or reject the proposal. However, the governing body
22	of the county:
23	(a) May modify the petition on the basis of criteria in ORS 198.805, as provided in ORS
24	198.810; or
25	(b) May reject the petition on the basis of criteria in ORS 198.805, as provided in ORS
26	198.810.
27	(4) If a proposal to establish an elected board of directors is contained in a petition
28	seeking a change of organization of a service district, the governing body of the county may
29	not modify or reject the proposal. The governing body of the county may modify or reject
30	the petition on the basis of criteria in ORS 198.705 to 198.955. However, if the governing body
31	does not reject the petition based on criteria in ORS 198.705 to 198.955, the governing body

of a county shall either: 1 2 (a) Approve the proposal and order an election of the service district board of directors; 3 or (b) Submit the question of whether to establish an elected board of directors to the 4 electors of the service district for a vote. 5 (5) The governing body of a service district elected pursuant to this section must be 6 composed of five or seven directors, based upon the number of directors specified in the pe-7 tition for formation or change of organization of the service district or in the motion of the 8 9 governing body of the county. (6) A director elected pursuant to this section shall hold office from July 1 next following 10 election. 11 12(7) The term of office of a director elected pursuant to this section is four years. However, a director shall hold office until the election and qualification of a successor. 13 (8) The board of directors of a service district shall fill a vacancy on the board as pro-14 15 vided in ORS 198.320. 16(9) An elector residing within the service district is qualified to be a member of the board 17of directors of the service district unless the elector is an employee of the service district. 18 SECTION 3. ORS 451.485 is amended to read: 451.485. (1) Except as provided in section 2 of this 2009 Act, the county court shall be the 19 governing body of a [county] service district established under ORS 451.410 to 451.610. 20(2) A district shall be known by the name or number specified in the order declaring its for-2122mation and by that name shall exercise and carry out the powers and duties conferred and declared in this chapter. 23(3) Before proceeding to construct or provide any service facilities authorized by this chapter, 24the governing body of the district shall make an order: 25[(1)] (a) Determining the service facilities to be constructed, maintained and operated and the 2627part of the work to be undertaken immediately. [(2)] (b) Determining the manner of financing the construction, maintenance and operation of the 2829service facilities. 30 [(3)] (c) Determining the method by which the district shall bear the share of the cost of con-31 struction of the service facilities that is to be apportioned to the district. [(4)] (d) Where it appears that any service facilities to be constructed will provide service to 32areas outside the district at some future date, determining the equitable and fair share of the cost 33 34 of construction of such facilities that should be borne by such areas, which share shall be borne by the revolving fund established under ORS 451.540, by funds obtained by the county under ORS 35 280.055 or by any other method of financing described by ORS 451.490 until such areas are served 36 37 by the facilities. 38 [(5)] (e) [Where] If the service facilities of the district are to be integrated into other service facilities constructed or being constructed by another district or by other public bodies as defined 39 in ORS 174.109, determining the fair and equitable amount the district should assume as its share 40 of the construction of such other service facilities, which amount shall be paid to the other district 41 or public body upon terms and conditions to which the governing body of the district has agreed. 42 [(6)] (f) In the case of sewage works, where trunk or interceptor sewers, treatment plants and 43 similar facilities are to be charged to all property within the district while lateral sewers, street 44 mains and similar facilities are to be charged only to property to be served immediately by the 45

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1	system, determining the fair and equitable share of the total cost to be charged to areas within the
2	district.
3	[(7)] (g) If any of the cost of the work is to be assessed against benefited property, describing
4	portions of the district, if any, within which service facilities will not be financed by assessment.
5	SECTION 4. ORS 451.410 is amended to read:
6	451.410. As used in ORS 451.410 to 451.610, unless the context indicates otherwise:
7	(1) "Change of organization" [has] means, in addition to the meaning given that term in ORS
8	198.705, a change in the services that the service district is authorized to construct, maintain
9	and operate or a change in the governance structure pursuant to section 2 of this 2009 Act.
10	(2) "County" has the meaning given that term in ORS 198.705.
11	(3) "County court" includes the board of county commissioners.
12	(4) "District" means a [county] service district established under ORS 451.410 to 451.610 to pro-
13	vide service facilities in a county or counties.
14	(5) "Formation" has the meaning given that term in ORS 198.705.
15	(6) "Owner" means the record owner of real property or the holder of a duly recorded contract
16	for purchase of real property within the district.
17	(7) "Rural unincorporated community" has the meaning given that term in ORS 221.034.
18	[(7)] (8) "Service facilities" means public service installations, works or services provided within
19	a county or counties for any or all of the purposes specified in ORS 451.010.
20	(9) "Urban unincorporated community" means an unincorporated community that:
21	(a) Includes at least 150 permanent residential dwelling units;
22	(b) Contains a mixture of land uses, including three or more public, commercial or in-
23	dustrial land uses;
24	(c) Includes areas served by a community sewer system; and
25	(d) Includes areas served by a community water system.
26	SECTION 5. (1) Section 2 of this 2009 Act applies on or after the effective date of this 2009
27	Act.
28	(2) The amendments to ORS 451.410 and 451.485 by sections 3 and 4 of this 2009 Act apply
29	to a proposal to establish an elected board of directors for a service district contained in ei-
30	ther a petition filed under ORS 198.800 or a motion of the governing body of a county on or
31	after the effective date of this 2009 Act.

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
