# House Bill 2586

Sponsored by Representative BUCKLEY; Representatives BERGER, CAMERON, DEMBROW, GALIZIO, GARRARD, GELSER, GILLIAM, GREENLICK, HOLVEY, HUFFMAN, JENSON, ROBLAN, VANORMAN, Senators BURDICK, CARTER, DEVLIN, METSGER, MONROE, NELSON, SCHRADER, WALKER, WINTERS

#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Allows Department of Education to award grants for school library programs. Requires school districts to include goals to implement strong school library program in local district continuous improvement plan.

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to school libraries; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 327.297 and 329.095.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 327.297 is amended to read:

5 327.297. (1) In addition to those moneys distributed through the State School Fund, the Depart-

6 ment of Education shall award grants to school districts, education service districts, the Youth

7 Corrections Education Program and the Juvenile Detention Education Program for activities that

8 relate to increases in student achievement, including:

9 (a) Early childhood support including establishing, maintaining or expanding quality 10 prekindergarten programs and full-day kindergarten programs;

11 (b) Class size reduction with an emphasis on the reduction of kindergarten through grade three 12 class sizes;

(c) Increases in instructional time including summer programs and before- and after-school pro grams;

15 (d) Mentoring, teacher retention and professional development;

16 (e) Remediation, alternative learning and student retention;

17 (f) Services to at-risk youth;

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18 (g) Programs to improve a student achievement gap between student groups identified by cul-

19 ture, poverty, language and race and other student groups;

20 (h) Vocational education programs;

21 (i) Literacy programs; [and]

#### 22 (j) School library programs; and

23 [(j)] (**k**) Other research-based student improvement strategies approved by the State Board of 24 Education.

25 (2)(a) Each school district, each education service district, the Youth Corrections Education

Program and the Juvenile Detention Education Program may apply to the Department of Education for a grant.

(b) The department shall review and approve applications based on criteria established by the
State Board of Education. In establishing the criteria, the State Board of Education shall consider
[the recommendations of the Quality Education Commission established under Executive Order 99-16

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and] the recommendations of the Quality Education Commission established under ORS 327.500.

2 (c) The applications shall include the activities to be funded and the goals of the district or 3 program for increases in student performance. The applications shall become part of the local dis-4 trict continuous improvement plan described in ORS 329.095.

5 (3) The Department of Education shall evaluate the annual progress of each recipient of grant 6 funds under this section toward the performance targets established by the Quality Education 7 [Commissions] Commission. The evaluation shall become part of the requirements of the department 8 for assessing the effectiveness of the district under ORS 329.085, 329.095 and 329.105. The depart-9 ment shall ensure district and program accountability by providing appropriate assistance, inter-10 vening and establishing consequences in order to support progress toward the performance targets.

(4) Each biennium the Department of Education shall issue a report to the Legislative Assemblyon the grant program and the results of the grant program.

(5)(a) Notwithstanding ORS 338.155 (9), the Department of Education may not award a grant
 under this section directly to a public charter school.

(b) A school district that receives a grant under this section may transfer a portion of the grant to a public charter school based on the charter of the school or any other agreement between the school district and the public charter school.

(c) A public charter school that receives grant funds under this subsection shall use those fundsfor the activities specified in subsection (1) of this section.

20 (6)(a) The amount of each grant for a program or school district = the program's or school 21 district's ADMw × (the total amount available for distribution to programs and school districts as 22 grants in each fiscal year  $\div$  the total ADMw of all programs and school districts that receive a 23 grant).

(b) The amount of each grant for an education service district = the education service district's
ADMw × (the total amount available for distribution to education service districts as grants in
each fiscal year ÷ the total ADMw of all education service districts that receive a grant).

27 (c) As used in this subsection, "ADMw" means:

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(A) For a school district, the extended weighted average daily membership as calculated under
ORS 327.013, 338.155 (1) and 338.165 [(2)] (3);

(B) For the Youth Corrections Education Program, the average daily membership as defined in
 ORS 327.006 multiplied by 2.0;

(C) For the Juvenile Detention Education Program, the average daily membership as defined in
 ORS 327.006 multiplied by 1.5; and

34 (D) For an education service district, the sum of the ADMw of the component school districts 35 of the education service district.

(7) Each district or program shall deposit the grant amounts it receives under this section in a
 separate account, and shall apply amounts in that account to pay for activities described in the
 district's or program's application.

(8) The State Board of Education may adopt any rules necessary for the administration of thegrant program.

41 SECTION 2. ORS 329.095 is amended to read:

42 329.095. (1) The Department of Education shall require school districts and schools to conduct 43 self-evaluations and update their local district continuous improvement plans on a biennial basis. 44 The self-evaluation process shall involve the public in the setting of local goals. The school districts 45 shall ensure that representatives from the demographic groups of their school population are invited

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1	to participate in the development of local district continuous improvement plans to achieve the
<b>2</b>	goals.
3	(2) As part of setting local goals, school districts shall undertake a communications process that
4	involves parents, students, teachers, school employees and community representatives to explain and
5	discuss the local goals and their relationship to programs under this chapter.
6	(3) At the request of the school district, department staff shall provide ongoing technical as-
7	sistance in the development and implementation of the local district continuous improvement plan.
8	(4) The local district continuous improvement plan shall include:
9	(a) Goals to implement the following:
10	[(a)] (A) A rigorous curriculum aligned with state standards;
11	[(b)] (B) High-quality instructional programs;
12	[(c)] (C) Short-term and long-term professional development plans;
13	[(d)] (D) Programs and policies [to] that achieve a safe educational environment;
14	[(e)] (E) A plan for family and community engagement;
15	[(f)] (F) Staff leadership development;
16	[(g)] (G) High-quality data systems;
17	[(h)] (H) Improvement planning that is data-driven;
18	[(i)] (I) Education service plans for students who have or have not exceeded all of the academic
19	content standards; and
20	(J) A strong school library program;
21	[(j)] (b) A review of demographics, student performance, staff characteristics and student access
22	to, and use of, educational opportunities; and
23	[(k)] (c) A description of district efforts to achieve local efficiencies and efforts to make better
24	use of resources.
25	SECTION 3. (1) The amendments to ORS 327.297 by section 1 of this 2009 Act first apply
26	to the 2010-2011 school year.
27	(2) The amendments to ORS 329.095 by section 2 of this 2009 Act first apply to local dis-
28	trict continuous improvement plans updated on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.

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
