# House Bill 2693

Sponsored by Representative KOTEK, Senator MONNES ANDERSON; Senator MORSE

#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Establishes standards for number of licensed nurses or school nurses required for number of students based on health needs of students.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for purposes of improving provision of licensed nurses and school nurses in schools.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to school nursing services; creating new provisions; amending ORS 329.025; appropriating 3

money; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. ORS 329.025 is amended to read: 5

6 329.025. It is the intent of the Legislative Assembly to maintain a system of public elementary

7 and secondary schools that allows students, parents, teachers, administrators, school district boards

8 and the State Board of Education to be accountable for the development and improvement of the

public school system. The public school system shall have the following characteristics: 9

10 (1) Provides equal and open access and educational opportunities for all students in the state regardless of their linguistic background, culture, race, gender, capability or geographic location; 11

12 (2) Assumes that all students can learn and establishes high, specific skill and knowledge ex-13 pectations and recognizes individual differences at all instructional levels;

(3) Provides special education, compensatory education, linguistically and culturally appropriate 14 education and other specialized programs to all students who need those services; 15

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#### (4) Supports the physical and cognitive growth and development of students;

[(4)] (5) Provides students with a solid foundation in the skills of reading, writing, problem 17 18 solving and communication;

[(5)] (6) Provides opportunities for students to learn, think, reason, retrieve information, use 19 20 technology and work effectively alone and in groups;

[(6)] (7) Provides for rigorous academic content standards and instruction in mathematics, sci-2122ence, English, history, geography, economics, civics, physical education, health, the arts and second 23languages;

24 [(7)] (8) Provides students an educational background to the end that they will function successfully in a constitutional republic, a participatory democracy and a multicultural nation and 2526 world;

27[(8)] (9) Provides students with the knowledge and skills that will provide the opportunities to 28 succeed in the world of work, as members of families and as citizens;

29 [(9)] (10) Provides students with the knowledge and skills that lead to an active, healthy life-30 style;

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1	[(10)] (11) Provides students with the knowledge and skills to take responsibility for their deci-
2	sions and choices;
3	[(11)] (12) Provides opportunities for students to learn through a variety of teaching strategies;
4	[(12)] (13) Emphasizes involvement of parents and the community in the total education of stu-
5	dents;
6	[(13)] (14) Transports children safely to and from school;
7	[(14)] (15) Ensures that the funds allocated to schools reflect the uncontrollable differences in
8	costs facing each district;
9	[(15)] (16) Ensures that local schools have adequate control of how funds are spent to best meet
10	the needs of students in their communities; and
11	[(16)] (17) Provides for a safe, educational environment.
12	SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:
13	(a) "Licensed nurse" means an individual who is licensed as a registered nurse or as a
14	licensed practical nurse under ORS 678.010 to 678.410.
15	(b) "Medically fragile students" means students who may have a life-threatening health
16	condition and who may require immediate professional nursing services.
17	(c) "Nursing-dependent students" means students who may have an unstable or life-
18	threatening health condition and who may require daily, direct and continuous professional
19	nursing services.
20	(d) "School nurse" has the meaning given that term in ORS 342.455.
21	(2) Each school district shall ensure that the district has a sufficient number of licensed
22	nurses and school nurses to provide:
23	(a) One licensed nurse or school nurse for every 125 medically fragile students.
24	(b) One licensed nurse or school nurse for each nursing-dependent student.
25	(3) The Department of Education shall submit to the State Board of Education and the
26	interim legislative committees related to education an annual report no later than October
27	1 of each year that is based on the previous school year and that provides information on:
28	(a) The availability of licensed nurses and school nurses in each school district; and
29	(b) The number of medically fragile students and nursing-dependent students in each
30	school district.
31	SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2009 Act becomes operative July 1, 2011.
32	SECTION 4. Section 2 of this 2009 Act is amended to read:

44	(2) Each school district shall ensure that the district has a sufficient number of licensed nurses
45	and school nurses to provide:

(a) One licensed nurse or school nurse for every 225 medically complex students. 1 2 [(a)] (b) One licensed nurse or school nurse for every 125 medically fragile students. [(b)] (c) One licensed nurse or school nurse for each nursing-dependent student. 3 (3) In addition to the requirements of subsection (2) of this section, each school district 4 is encouraged to have one licensed nurse or school nurse for every 750 students in the school 5 district. 6 (4) A school district may satisfy the requirements described in subsection (2)(a) of this 7 section and the recommendations described in subsection (3) of this section by: 8 9 (a) Providing trained personnel supervised by a licensed nurse or school nurse; and (b) Complying with the requirements of ORS 678.010 to 678.445. 10 [(3)] (5) The Department of Education shall submit to the State Board of Education and the in-11 12 terim legislative committees related to education an annual report no later than October 1 of each 13 year that is based on the previous school year and that provides information on: (a) The availability of licensed nurses and school nurses in each school district; and 14 15(b) The number of medically complex students, medically fragile students and nursingdependent students in each school district. 16 SECTION 5. For the purpose of fulfilling the recommendation for licensed nurses and 17 18 school nurses in a school district, as described in section 2 (3) of this 2009 Act, school dis-19 tricts are encouraged to provide: (1) One licensed nurse or school nurse for every 3,500 students by July 1, 2014. 20(2) One licensed nurse or school nurse for every 2,500 students by July 1, 2016. 2122(3) One licensed nurse or school nurse for every 1,500 students by July 1, 2018. (4) One licensed nurse or school nurse for every 750 students by July 1, 2020. 23SECTION 6. Section 5 of this 2009 Act and the amendments to section 2 of this 2009 Act 24by section 4 of this 2009 Act become operative July 1, 2012. 25SECTION 7. There is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the biennium 2627beginning July 1, 2009, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_ to be used as follows:  $\_$  to be used to conduct an analysis of the delivery of school nursing services 28 $(1) \$ to schools in this state and issue recommendations on the most cost-effective models to de-2930 liver school nursing services based on geography, the size of the school district, the health 31 needs of students and other factors identified by the department. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 35 36 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 37 July 1, 2009.

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
