House Bill 2959

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Prohibits hospital from using patient's credit or financial information in determining course of care recommended by physician. Imposes civil penalty for violations.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to financial information.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) An officer or employee of a hospital licensed by the Department of Hu-

5 man Services may not use a person's credit or other financial information in determining,

- 6 altering or prescribing the course of care recommended for the person by a physician li-
- 7 censed under ORS chapter 677.
- 8 (2) Nothing in this section is intended to relieve a person of the obligation to pay for 9 services provided by a hospital.
- 10 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Department of Human Services may impose a civil penalty in an amount
- 11 not to exceed \$5,000 for a violation of section 1 of this 2009 Act. Civil penalties under this

12 section shall be imposed in the manner provided by ORS 183.745.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 1 of this 2009 Act applies to decisions about a person's course of care
implemented on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.
