6	On <u>page 3</u> , after line 23, insert:
7	"SECTION 3. Section 4 of this 2009 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 431.623 to
8	431.671.
9	"SECTION 4. (1) As used in this section, 'individually identifiable information' means:
10	"(a) Individually identifiable health information as that term is defined in ORS 179.505;
11	and
12	"(b) Information that could be used to identify a health care provider, ambulance service
13	medical transportation agency or health care facility.
14	"(2) Notwithstanding ORS 431.627, individually identifiable information may be released
15	from the Oregon Trauma Registry:
16	"(a) For use in executive session to conduct specific case reviews by:
17	"(A) The State Trauma Advisory Board or any area trauma advisory board;
18	"(B) The State Emergency Medical Service Committee; or
19	"(C) The Emergency Medical Services for Children Advisory Committee.
20	"(b) For quality assurance or quality improvement purposes to an emergency medical
21	services provider or a designated trauma center if the information is related to the treat-
22	ment of an individual by the provider or center.
23	"(c) To a person conducting research only if an institutional review board has approved
24	the research in accordance with 45 C.F.R. part 46 and the person agrees to maintain the
25	confidentiality of the information.
26	"(3) The Department of Human Services may release only the minimum amount of indi-
27	vidually identifiable information necessary to carry out the purposes for which it is released
28	under this section.
29	" <u>SECTION 5.</u> ORS 431.617 is amended to read:
30	"431.617. [No provider shall] (1) A provider may not be held liable for acting in accordance
31	with approved trauma system plans.
32	"(2) A person who in good faith provides data or other information to the Oregon Trauma
33	Registry in accordance with ORS 431.623 to 431.671 is immune from any civil or criminal li-
34	ability that might otherwise be incurred or imposed with respect to provision of the data.".
