SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Allows Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to establish temporary programs to train and certify specialized building inspectors to enforce portions of specialty codes.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to building inspection program personnel.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2009 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 455.715 to 4 $\mathbf{5}$ 455.740.

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6 SECTION 2. (1) The Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services, with 7 the advice of the appropriate advisory boards, may adopt rules establishing one or more 8 programs to train, qualify and certify an individual as a specialized building inspector au-9 thorized to enforce portions of specialty codes. Notwithstanding ORS 455.720 (1) and 455.725,

10 the rules may include, but need not be limited to, rules that establish:

11 (a) Work experience, training and other qualifications for program participation;

12(b) Content and presentation requirements for training programs;

13 (c) Methods for verifying the qualification of the individual to enforce portions of spe-14 cialty codes as a specialized building inspector certified under this section;

(d) The portions of various specialty codes that each program will enable a qualifying 15individual to enforce and any terms, conditions or classifications applicable for that 16 17 enforcement; and

18 (e) The form of, content of and method of submission for an application, fees reasonably calculated to recover costs and any other requirements the director believes reasonable for 19 20 the administration and enforcement of this section.

21(2) Notwithstanding ORS 446.250, 455.630, 455.720, 455.725, 479.530, 479.810, 479.855, 480.530 and 480.565, the director may issue or cause to be issued a certificate as a specialized building 22 23 inspector to an individual who successfully completes an approved training program and 24 satisfies qualification verification under this section. Notwithstanding ORS 455.715, a spe-25 cialized building inspector certified under this section is considered a building inspector cer-26 tified under ORS 455.715 to 455.740 regardless of whether the specialized building inspector 27 is charged with the responsibility of routine enforcement of a specialty code.

28(3) An individual certified as a specialized building inspector under this section may conduct inspections and enforce portions of specialty codes as identified by the director. The 29 30 enforcement of portions of specialty codes by a specialized building inspector is subject to

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1 any terms, conditions or classifications applicable to that enforcement established by the

2 director by rule.

3 SECTION 3. (1) Section 2 of this 2009 Act is repealed January 2, 2016.

4 (2) Notwithstanding the repeal of section 2 of this 2009 Act by subsection (1) of this sec-5 tion, unless suspended or revoked, a certificate issued under section 2 of this 2009 Act that 6 is in effect on January 2, 2016, shall continue in effect until the earlier of:

7 (a) The expiration of the certificate term; or

8 **(b) January 2, 2018.**

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
