\$1,553,207.

House Bill 5022), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$2,971,639.

20 <u>SECTION 6.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-21 ated to the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training, for the biennium beginning 22 July 1, 2009, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,056,000 for operations.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
made to the Department of Justice by section 1, chapter \_\_\_\_, Oregon Laws 2009 (Enrolled
Senate Bill 5518), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$456,835 for paying
expenses of district attorneys.

SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (2), chapter \_\_\_\_, Oregon Laws
2009 (Enrolled House Bill 5040), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by
\$1,105,814 for the Public Defense Services Account.

SECTION 9. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri ated to the Judicial Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the General
Fund, the amount of \$131,064 for operations.

34 <u>SECTION 10.</u> Sections 1 to 9 of this 2009 Act become operative only if House Bill 3508
35 becomes law. Sections 1 to 9 of this 2009 Act become operative on the date House Bill 3508
36 becomes law.

37 <u>SECTION 11.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 38 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 39 July 1, 2009.
