## **House Joint Memorial 13**

Sponsored by Representative G SMITH

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Urges Congress to fund additional medical facilities for dental, audiology and optometry care for veterans.

<b>2</b>	To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United
3	States of America, in Congress assembled:
4	We, your memorialists, the Seventy-fifth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in legis-
<b>5</b>	lative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
6	Whereas members of the Oregon National Guard ordered to federal active duty and deployed to
7	war zones, as well as Oregonians enlisted in the United States Armed Forces and deployed to war
8	zones, constitute the largest deployment since World War II, resulting in an enormous increase in
9	the need for medical facilities; and
10	Whereas the Jonathan M. Wainwright Memorial Veterans Affairs Medical Center located in
11	Walla Walla, Washington, which provides medical care for northern Oregon veterans, has received
12	\$75 million to upgrade its present medical facilities to meet the highest standards of medical care;
13	and
14	Whereas in the last few years the United States Department of Veterans Affairs has completed
15	outpatient clinics in LaGrande, Oregon, Lewiston, Idaho, and the Tri-cities area in Washington,
16	which will allow veterans to receive medical care closer to where they live; and
17	Whereas medical facilities are proposed, but unfunded, to provide dental care, audiology and
18	optometry services; and
19	Whereas the United States Department of Veterans Affairs is to be commended for anticipating
20	the need for updated medical facilities to better serve veterans in eastern Oregon, eastern
21	Washington and western Idaho; and
22	Whereas Oregon veterans deserve to have locally available modern medical facilities; now,
23	therefore,
24	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
25	(1) The Seventy-fifth Legislative Assembly respectfully urges the Congress of the United States
26	to fund the additional medical facilities for dental, audiology and optometry care for veterans.
27	(2) A copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of the United States, to the Senate
28	Majority Leader, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to each member of the Oregon
29	Congressional Delegation.
