# Senate Bill 113

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#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Exempts certain post-secondary schools from degree requirements of Office of Degree Authorization if school accredited by accreditor approved by office. Establishes procedure by which accreditor becomes approved by office.

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to accreditation of post-secondary schools; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 2 348.597. 3

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2009 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 348.594 to 5 6 348.615.

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SECTION 2. (1) A school is exempt from ORS 348.594 to 348.615 if the school is accredited 7 by an accreditor of post-secondary schools and the accreditor is approved by the Office of 8 Degree Authorization as provided by subsection (2) of this section. 9

10 (2) The Office of Degree Authorization shall approve an accreditor of post-secondary schools if the accreditor meets all of the following requirements: 11

12 (a) The accreditor is recognized as an accreditor of post-secondary schools by the United 13 States Department of Education or is a member of a nationally recognized organization that is committed to promoting the accreditation process. 14

(b) The accreditor has accreditation standards substantially equivalent to accreditation 15 standards adopted by rule by the Office of Degree Authorization. 16

(c) The accreditor permits evaluators designated by the Office of Degree Authorization 17to participate in the accreditation process of a school that operates or will operate in 18 Oregon. 19

20 (d) The accreditor provides the Office of Degree Authorization with access to all documents under the control of the accreditor that are produced by the accreditor or by the 21 school during the accreditation process. 22

23(3)(a) If the Office of Degree Authorization determines that the accreditation standards 24 of an accreditor are not substantially equivalent to the accreditation standards of the Office of Degree Authorization, the accreditor may request review of the determination by the 25Oregon Student Assistance Commission. As a result of a review conducted under this para-26 27graph, the commission may allow the accreditor to apply the accreditation standards of the 28 accreditor.

29 (b) Accreditors that do not have accreditation standards that are substantially equivalent to accreditation standards of the Office of Degree Authorization, as determined under para-30

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graph (a) of this subsection or subsection (2)(b) of this section, may not be approved by the 1 2 office.

(4) A school that operates or will operate in Oregon and that refuses to allow the Office 3 of Degree Authorization to participate in the accreditation process of the school or refuses 4 to provide documents under the control of the school that are produced by the school or the 5 accreditor during the accreditation process may not qualify as a school that is accredited by 6 an accreditor approved by the office as provided by this section. 7

(5) A school that seeks accreditation by an accreditor approved by the Office of Degree 8 9 Authorization as provided by this section is responsible for the payment of any fees imposed under ORS 348.607. 10

(6) A school that is accredited by an accreditor approved by the Office of Degree Au-11 12thorization as provided by this section must be evaluated at least once every three years to determine whether the school continues to meet the accreditation standards of the 13 accreditor. 14

15 (7)(a) A person alleging a violation of an accreditation standard by a school that is accredited by an accreditor approved by the Office of Degree Authorization as provided by this 16 section may file a complaint with the office. Upon receipt of a complaint, the Office of Degree 17 18 Authorization shall:

19 (A) Refer the complaint to the accreditor of the school if the accreditor has a process for resolving the complaint; or 20

(B) Resolve the complaint if the accreditor declines to resolve the complaint or the 2122accreditor does not have a process for resolving the complaint.

23(b) Any party to a complaint filed under this subsection may request that the Oregon Student Assistance Commission review a resolution made under paragraph (a)(B) of this 24 subsection. An action taken pursuant to a review by the commission under this paragraph 25is binding on the school. 26

27(8) Documents in the control of the Office of Degree Authorization or the Oregon Student Assistance Commission are public records if they are: 28

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(a) Produced during the accreditation process for a school that is a public school; or

30 (b) Used or produced for the resolution of a complaint filed as described in subsection (7) 31 of this section, except that the person filing the complaint may request that any personally identifiable information be removed from the documents. 32

SECTION 3. ORS 348.597 is amended to read: 33

34 348.597. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, ORS 348.594 to 348.615 35apply to all schools that operate in Oregon.

(2) ORS 348.594 to 348.615 do not apply to: 36

37 [(1)] (a) An Oregon community college;

(b) A school licensed by the Department of Education under ORS 345.010 to 345.450; 38

[(2)] (c) A state institution of higher education within the Oregon University System; 39

[(3)] (d) The Oregon Health and Science University; 40

[(4) A school that has conferred degrees under the same control for five years in Oregon from at 41 least one operationally separate unit accredited as a separate institution by a regional accrediting as-42 sociation or its national successor:] 43

[(5) A school that, on the date preceding July 15, 2005, was a school described in ORS 348.594 44 (2)(d); or]45

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- 1 [(6)] (e) A school that is exempt from ORS 348.594 to 348.615 under ORS 348.604[.]; or
- 2 (f) A school that is accredited by an accreditor of post-secondary schools that is approved
- 3 by the Office of Degree Authorization under section 2 of this 2009 Act.
- 4 <u>SECTION 4.</u> Section 2 of this 2009 Act first applies to schools beginning the accreditation 5 process on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.

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
