2	In line 21, delete "the" and insert "a degenerative condition that causes".
3	In lines 28 and 29, restore the bracketed material and delete the boldfaced material.
4	On page 3, delete lines 6 through 45 and delete pages 4 through 9 and insert:
5	" <u>SECTION 2.</u> ORS 127.540 is amended to read:
6	"127.540. ORS 127.505 to 127.660 and 127.995 do not authorize an appointed health care repre-
7	sentative to make a health care decision with respect to any of the following on behalf of the prin-
8	cipal:
9	"(1) Admission to or retention in a health care facility for care or treatment of mental illness.
10	For purposes of this section, dementia and behavior caused by dementia are not mental ill-
11	ness.
12	"(2) Convulsive treatment.
13	"(3) Psychosurgery.
14	"(4) Sterilization.
15	"(5) Abortion.
16	"(6) Withholding or withdrawing of a life-sustaining procedure unless:
17	"(a) The appointed health care representative has been given authority to make decisions on
18	withholding or withdrawing life-sustaining procedures; or
19	"(b) The principal has been medically confirmed to be in one of the following conditions:
20	"(A) A terminal condition.
21	"(B) Permanently unconscious.
22	"(C) A condition in which administration of life-sustaining procedures would not benefit the
23	principal's medical condition and would cause permanent and severe pain.
24	"(D) A progressive, debilitating illness that will be fatal and is in its advanced stages, and the
25	principal is consistently and permanently unable to communicate, swallow food and water safely,
26	care for the principal, and recognize the principal's family and other people, and there is no rea-
27	sonable chance that the principal's underlying condition will improve.
28	"(7) Withholding or withdrawing artificially administered nutrition and hydration, other than
29	hyperalimentation, necessary to sustain life except as provided in ORS 127.580.".
